Gentlemen:

At the request of Council Resolution #509, dated July 17, 1953, the Traffic Engineering Department has studied the advisability of prohibiting pedestrian crossings under the railroad overpass on Promenade Street, Francis Street and Gaspee Street.

Pedestrian counts at the above locations by our field investigators showed the pedestrian crossing activity to be very light and in our opinion not sufficient to justify the installation of barrier chains at this time.

The most dangerous point of pedestrian-vehicle conflict appeared on Gaspee Street just north of Emmet Square on the easterly side. Therefore, this area on Gaspee Street from Emmet Square to the railroad overpass shall have pedestrian barrier chains erected in the very near future.
