WHEREAS, We must not forget the student body and faculty for the huge support of their Boy's Basketball Team because, without their support, this team might not have had such a fine season,

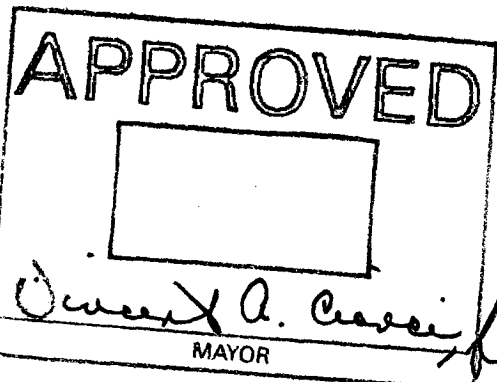
