Dear Ms. Mendonca:

I am writing to you in reference to the resolution passed by the City Council requesting that the Providence Public Library consider opening the Mt. Pleasant branch additional days to meet consumer demands.

We share with members of the City Council a desire to open all the branches longer hours to better serve the local communities. It is our goal for all branches to be open six days a week. Unfortunately, we are at the moment hard pressed to maintain our current schedule at the central location and the branches.

If the City acts favorably on our request for additional funds (we have requested \$1,200,000 for fiscal '86), this would enable us to maintain our current operation throughout the city. If the Council would entertain the notion of increasing funding beyond the amount requested, we could then begin to seriously consider opening the branches more days.

We realize that the Mt. Pleasant branch, in particular, has a large constituency of users who care about library services. We hope you will pass on to them our willingness to consider their suggestion if additional funding is available.

We appreciate the efforts of everyone at City Hall for the library, but we must be realistic in terms of what we can deliver considering our current lean staffing.
