

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 437

Approved September 3, 1954

Whereas, On August 31, 1954, the City of Providence was visited by a hurricane which caused great damage to municipal property and serious damage to the property of the inhabitants of the City, and emergency measures are necessary to provide for the immediate preservation of public peace, property, health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to take all necessary measures for the relief of the inhabitants of the City and for the preservation of municipal property, the City Council hereby declares that an emergency situation exists; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has this day enacted an emergency ordinance providing for the issuance of bonds in the sum of one million five hundred thousand (\$1,500,000) dollars for the relief of the inhabitants of the City of Providence and for the preservation of municipal property, under the emergency provisions of Sections 25, 27 and 135 of the Charter of the City of Providence as amended by Chapter 1266 of the Public Laws of 1943, with respect to bonds issued in case of fire, flood, hurricane or other calamity, and acting under the provisions of Chapter 1017 of the Public Laws of 1902, with respect to the issuance of notes.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City Treasurer, acting under the Committee on Finance, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time and in such amounts as may be approved by the Committee on Finance, a sum not to exceed One million five hundred thousand (\$1,500,000) Dollars, and to issue and sell at private sale, the City's negotiable notes, original and in renewal thereof, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding one and one-half (1½%) percentum per annum, said original notes and any renewal notes therefor to be signed by the City Treasurer and countersigned by the Mayor and the Chairman of the Committee on Finance; said original notes to mature not exceeding six (6) months from the date of issuance, and the same may be renewed from time to time for further periods of six (6) months, but said notes shall mature in any event within three (3) years from the date of the first issuance; the money thus obtained to be bonded under the provisions of
