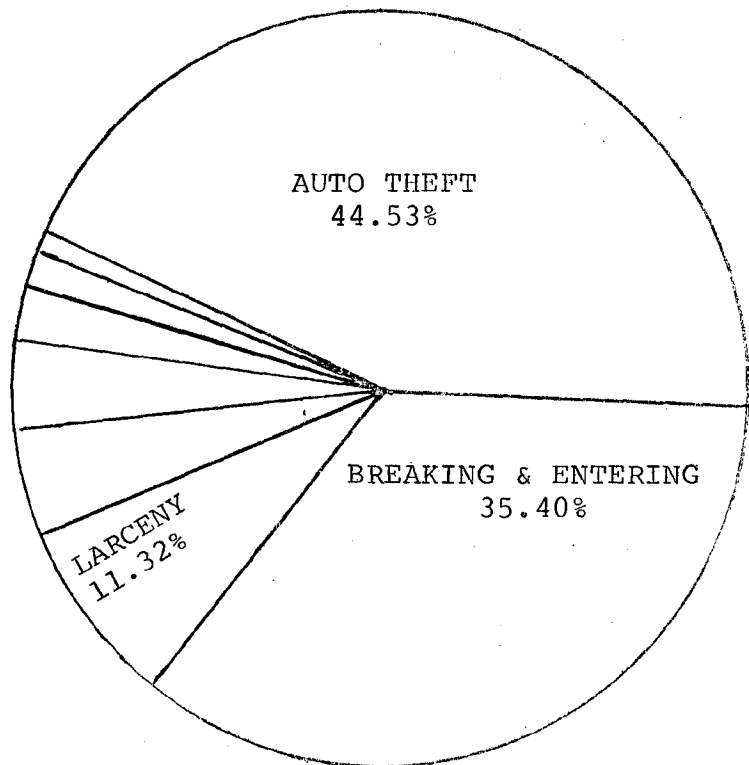

CLEARANCE OF PART 1 OFFENSES REPORTED TO THE POLICE

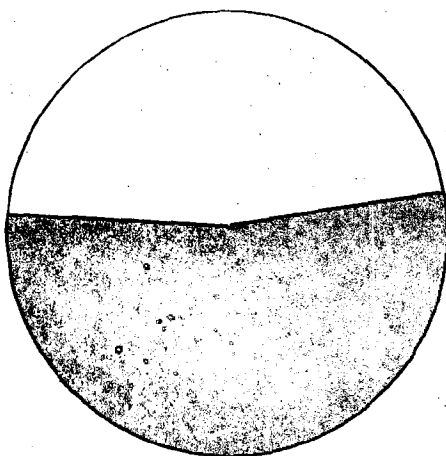

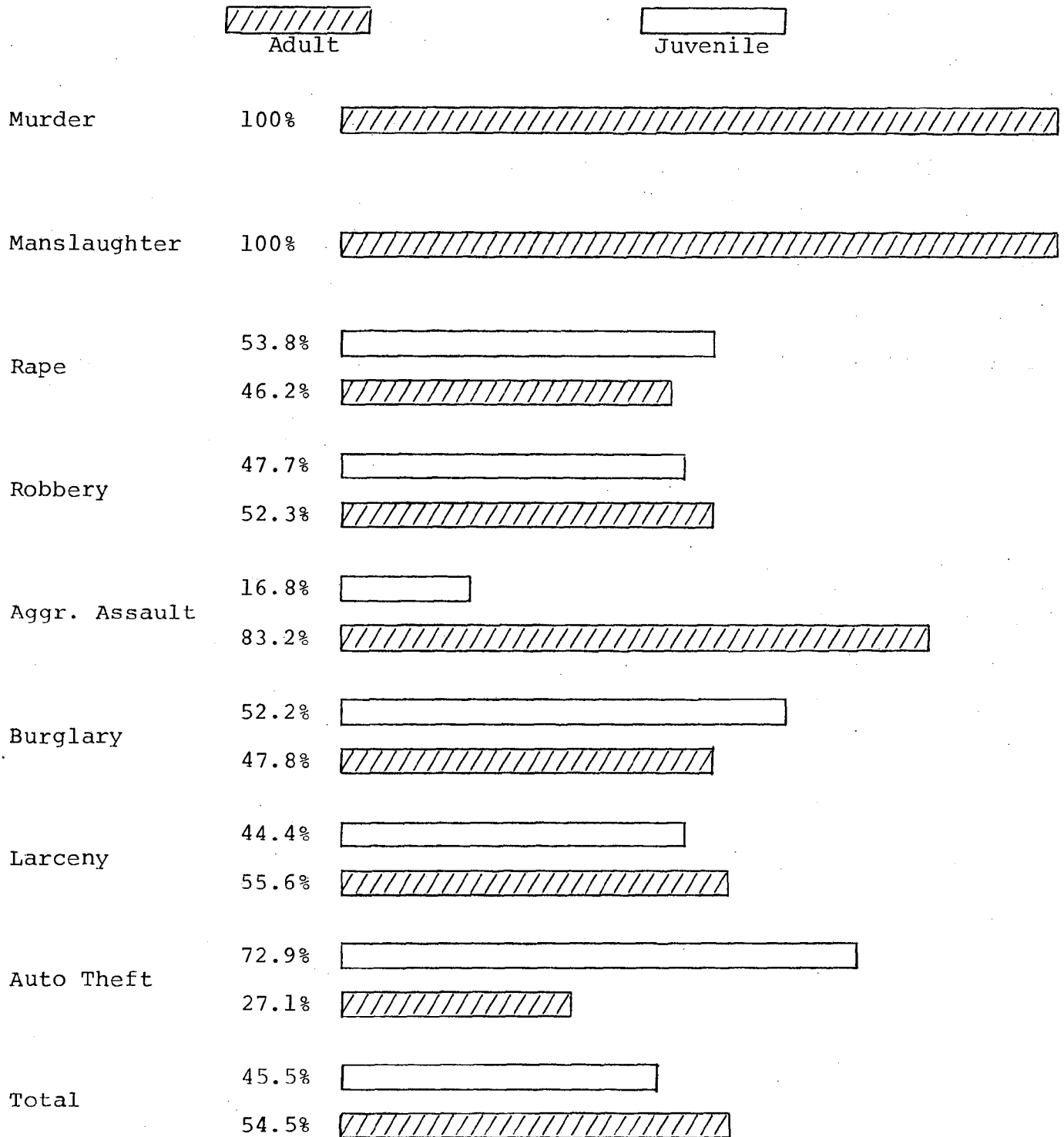

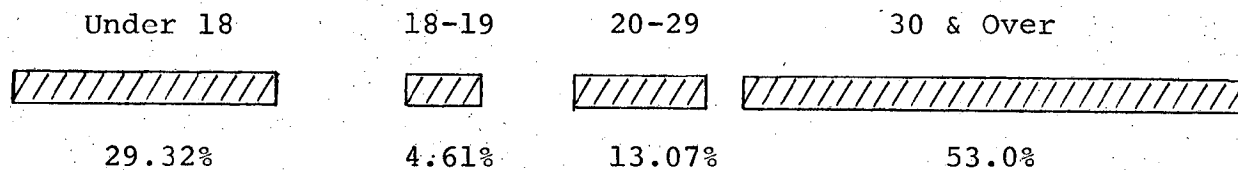

ADULT-JUVENILE ARRESTS FOR PART 1 OFFENSES IN PROVIDENCE IN 1970

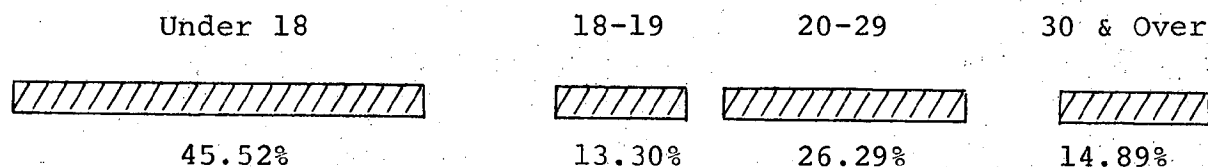


COMPARISON OF POPULATION AGE GROUPS TO ARREST AGE GROUPS

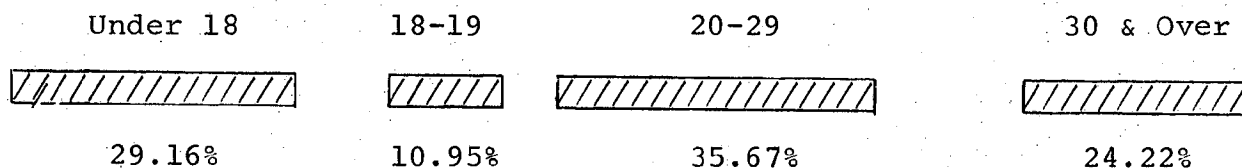
PROVIDENCE POPULATION BY AGE GROUPS*



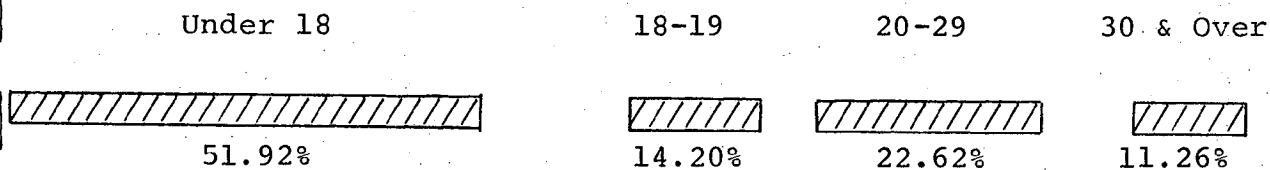
PERSONS ARRESTED FOR PART 1 OFFENSES
