# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 566

Approved October 29, 1976

WHEREAS, death has recently taken from this life, Andrew L. Jackson, Jr., Doctor of Dental Surgery, who had been practicing that profession in the City of Providence, for more than fifteen years, and

WHEREAS, Doctor Jackson, a World War II Veteran in the United States Army Air Force, was active in community affairs, serving on the Executive Board of the Narragansett Council of the Boy Scouts of America, the Board of the Providence Urban League and in Fraternal Organizations, having been a Member of Celestial Lodge, F & A M; Mount Sinai Consistory No. 12, and Constantine Temple No. 14, PHA, and

WHEREAS, as a dentist, Doctor Jackson served on the dental clinic staff of the Rhode Island Medical Society and the Memorial Hospital in Pawtucket and held Memberships in the American Dental Association and the Providence District Dental Society, and

WHEREAS, Doctor Jackson gave additionally of his professional skill serving as a Member of the American Academy of Oral Medicine, as Secretary of its New England Chapter; the Committee, as a State Advisor of the Tri-State Regional Medical Program and as a Board Member of the Providence Unit of the American Cancer Society, and

WHEREAS, Doctor Jackson's scholastic achievements included a degree at Lincoln University in Oxford, Pennsylvania and Howard University Dental School in Washington, District of Columbia, finding time to serve as Vice-President of Mu Theta Mambda, Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., and

WHEREAS, as a communicant of the Congdon Street Baptist Church, he served on the Board of Trustees,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in the passing of Andrew L. Jackson, Jr., D.D.S., at the early age of fifty-two years, the community in which he lived and served professionally, fraternally, and religously, is saddened by his passing, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the prayers of this City Council, for his eternal repose, be hereby conveyed to his survivors.
