

Dear Council President and Members of the City Council:

In accordance with your Resolution No. 377, approved June 26, 1980, we furnish you with the following information:

The sub-stations were closed because of lack of money to operate them and the termination of the CETA funds for the personnel.

Back on June 4, 1980, the Police Department did make a request to the Providence CETA Administration for fifteen (15) individuals who could be employed at three (3) police sub-stations in the City.

As of this writing, I have not been advised.

In the event that CETA cannot finance these positions, we will be able to furnish you with some cost information, if there is any possibility that such an appropriation could be made without depleting any other portions of the police budget.
