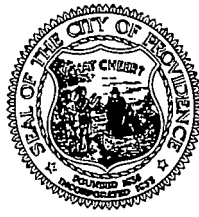

SUBJECT: Resolution requesting the Traffic Engineer to cause the installation of "Wrong Way" signs and "STOP" signs, facing east at the intersection of Ives Street and Trenton Street, as many vehicles exit 195, drive the wrong way on Trenton, and pose an added hazard by failing to stop or yield at said intersection.

The office of Traffic Engineering has investigated this request and created Work Order # 2054 September 20, 2005 to install two (2) "Wrong Way" signs on Trenton Street, facing east, at its intersection with Ives Street. The request to install a STOP sign in the area in question is denied because it would be the improper use of a stop sign on a One Way street.
