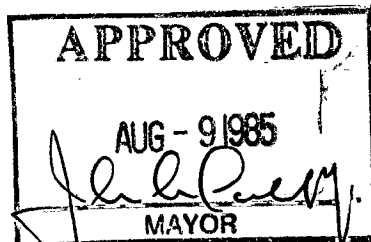
Approved August 9, 1985



Re: Boarding Liens - 48-50 Lenox Avenue

The building at 48-50 Lenox Avenue was originally inspected by this Department after a heavy fire had damaged the structure on January 12, 1981. We were unable to locate the owner of the property, posted notice on the property, and the property was properly boarded subsequent to our notice. The property again became open in 1983 and we again posted the notice; however, no attempt was made to secure the property.

From December 1983 to the present, this Department has spent \$460.00 boarding the property, the last time being on June 10, 1985.

I notice that this petition is being made by the Elmwood Neighborhood Housing Services. As a member of their Board of Directors for over six years, I am well aware of the efforts they have been making to rehabilitate the Elmwood area.

I have, therefore, no objection to the release of these liens.
