in AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 544 OF THE

ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, APPROVED SEPTEMBER 21, 1951, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, BY CHANGING FROM AN R-2 TWO-FAMILY ZONE TO AN M-1 GENERAL INDUSTRIAL ZONE THE EASTERLY PORTION OF LOT 313, NOW IN AN R-2 TWO-FAMILY ZONE, AS SET OUT AND DELINEATED ON CITY ASSESSOR'S PLAT 89, LOCATED ON THE WESTERLY ENDS OF THE FOLLOWING DEAD-END STREETS: BISSELL, SPOONER, SAWYER AND THURSTON STREETS.

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1: The zoning map accompanying and made a part of Chapter 544, approved September 21, 1951 entitled "An Ordinance Zoning the City of Providence and Establishing Use, Height and Area Regulations" is hereby amended by changing from an R-2 Two-Family Zone to an M-1 General Industrial Zone, the easterly portion of Lot 313, as set out and delineated on City Assessor's Plat 89, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the northerly line of Hathaway Street at the southeasterly corner of Lot 313 on Assessor's Plat 89; thence generally northerly along the present easterly boundary of the General Industrial Zone (M-1) to the northerly line of Lot 313; thence easterly along the said northerly line of Lot 313 to the northeasterly corner of said Lot 313; thence generally southerly along the easterly line of said Lot 313 to the northerly line of Hathaway Street and the point and place of beginning.

SEC. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

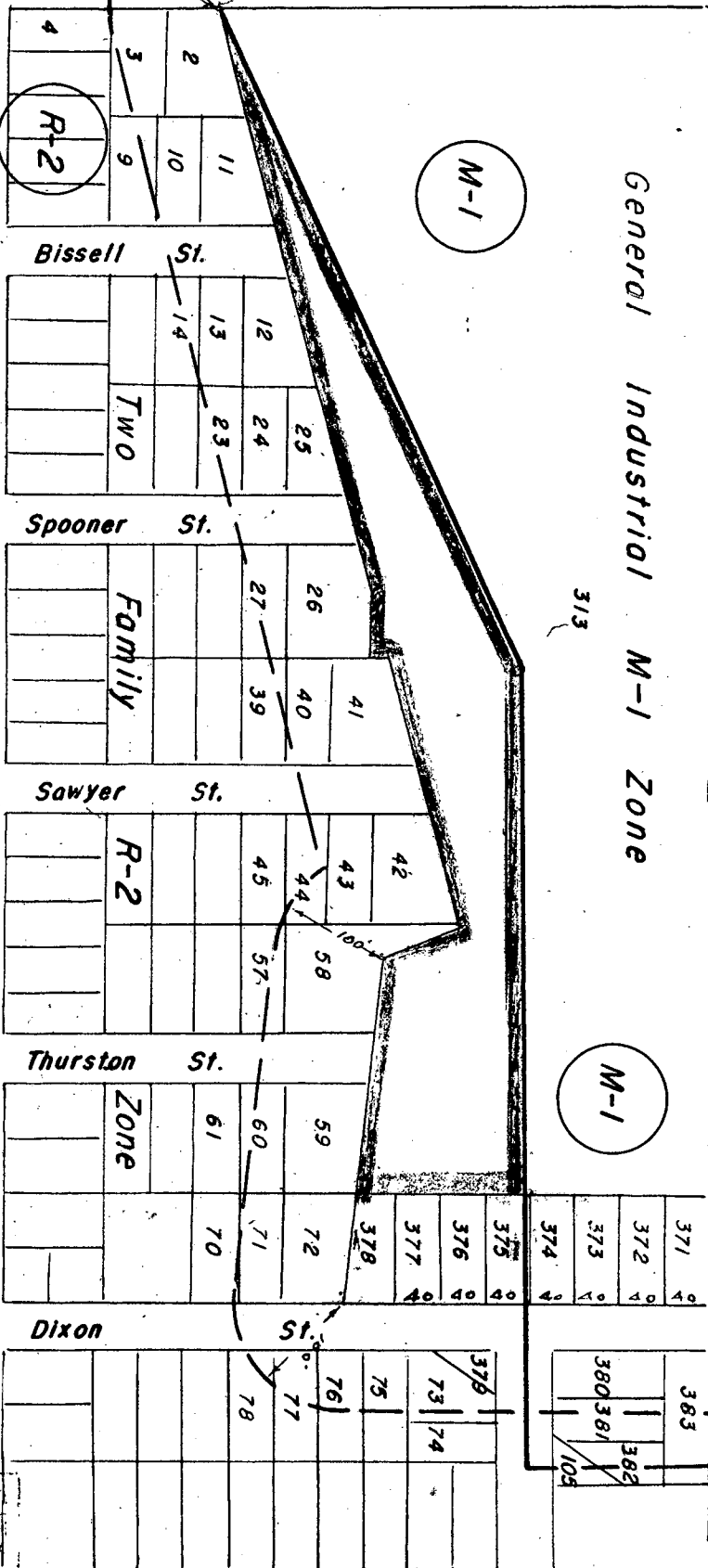

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

Section 1. Chapter 544 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence as approved September 21, 1951 and as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following section:

### Sec. 103 Limitation upon Successive Petitions.

No petition for an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance including the Zoning Map, or no application for an exception or variance therefrom shall be accepted by the Clerk of the City Council or the Secretary of the Zoning Board of Review if a petition or application praying for the same amendment, exception or variance has been denied or the petitioner granted leave to withdraw within the preceding twelve months, provided, that such a petition or application may be accepted at any time with the consent of the Committee on Ordinances or the Zoning Board of Review respectively, if it shall include or be accompanied by an affidavit which, in the opinion of said Committee on Ordinances or said Zoning Board of Review sets forth facts indicating a substantial change of circumstances justifying a hearing on said petition or application for exception or variance.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and all Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 103. Limitation upon successive petitions.

No petition for an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance including the zoning map, or no application for an exception or variance therefrom shall be accepted by the City Council or the Secretary of the Zoning Board or the Board of Zoning Appeals or application praying for the same amendment, exception or variance has been denied or the petitioner granted leave to withdraw within the preceding twelve months, provided that such a petition or application may be accepted at any time with the consent of the Committee on Ordinances or the Zoning Board of Review respectively, if it shall include or be accompanied by an affidavit which, in the opinion of said Committee on Ordinances or said Zoning Board of Review sets forth facts indicating a substantial change of circumstances justifying a hearing on said petition or application for exception or variance.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and all Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER 899

No. 538 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION TO SALARIED EMPLOYEES AND EMPLOYEES NOT NORMALLY ENTITLED TO OVER-TIME PAY FOR HOLIDAY WORK AND UNUSUAL ADDITIONAL HOURS OF WORK FOLLOWING RECENT HURRICANES.

Approved October 8, 1954

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1: It is hereby ordained that the Finance Director of the City of Providence be authorized and directed to allow the heads of the various departments of the City to submit emergency payrolls for salaried employees and employees who are not normally entitled to overtime pay who have performed holiday work and unusual additional hours of work following the recent hurricanes of August 31, 1954 and September 11, 1954. The names of the employees and the number of hours worked by each employee shall be submitted to the Finance Director for approval. The rate of pay shall be determined by converting the weekly rate into an hourly rate, based upon the normal work week of a particular employee and the employee shall be paid overtime pay at the rate of one and one-half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ) times the hourly rate as determined above. Those employees normally paid for holidays shall be paid straight time for the first eight hours worked, and one and one-half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ) times the hourly rate for the hours worked in excess thereof. For the purpose of this ordinance, a normal work week shall not exceed forty-eight hours.

SEC. 2. All sums spent under the provisions of this ordinance shall be charged to the account entitled "1954 Hurricane Rehabilitation Account" established by Chapter 876 of the Ordinances approved September 3, 1954.

SEC. 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage, and for the purpose of this ordinance, the provisions of Chapter 763 of the Ordinances of 1953 entitled "An Ordinance Establishing a Compensation Plan for the City of Providence", etc., are hereby waived.

in accordance with the provisions of Section 28 of Chapter 1665 of the Public Laws of 1945, approved April 27, 1945, the City Controller is hereby authorized and directed to establish in the accounts for the year ending September 30, 1955, a specific purpose account to be known as "Reserve for Revenue for Extraordinary Expenditures of the Year 1954-1955." Said account shall be established by charging to the account entitled "Current Year Surplus" of the accounts of 1953-1954, an amount equal to any remaining credit balance existing in said Current Year Surplus account at the close of the fiscal year. After completion of the above transfer, the account entitled "Reserve for Revenue for Extraordinary Expenditures of the Year 1954-1955" shall be carried over to the books of account for the year 1954-1955 with an open credit balance equal to the amount of the transfer.

From time to time during the year ending September 30, 1955, the City council, when necessary, may direct the City Controller and City Treasurer to pay out of General Fund cash the total or any part of the then credit balance existing in the account entitled "Reserve for Revenue for Extraordinary Expenditures of the year 1954-1955"; each such payment shall be charged to said account and shall immediately be paid over to the City Collector as a receipt account, and when so received by him, shall be credited to a receipt account to be entitled "Receipts for Extraordinary Expenditures of the Year 1954-1955."
