





Gentlemen:

At the request of Council Resolution No. 570, dated September 22, 1952, the Traffic Engineer has studied the advisability of authorizing parking on the westerly side of Mathewson Street from Fountain Street to Weybosset Street after 6:15 P.M. I want to point out that much of our 1953 construction program hinges on Mathewson Street and from anticipated changes in the Central Business District, we are expecting much more traffic to be using Mathewson Street in the very near future.

Since any changes in the parking regulations would have to be rescinded at that time, I feel that the best solution is to permit the operation to continue as it has in the past and therefore, I am denying the establishment of parking on Mathewson Street at this time.

Gentlemen:

At the request of Council Resolution No. 583, dated October 3, 1952, the Traffic Engineer has studied the advisability of installing "Yield" or "Stop" signs on Almira Avenue at the intersection of Unit Street.

Even though sight distances are partially restricted at the corners of the above intersection, there has been only one reported accident from January 1, 1950 to October 30, 1952. The traffic volumes are very low particularly those volumes on Almira Avenue and certainly not high enough to justify the installation of "Yield" or "Stop" signs.

Since at the intersection of Almira Avenue at Unit Street has had such a good safety record and does have very low traffic volumes, I feel that your request for any type of traffic control must be denied at this time.

Dear Sir:

The attached petition requesting a patrolman or Crossing Guard at Sackett and Niagara Streets has been investigated.

Captain Edward H. Kelly, Director of the Division of Women and Juveniles reports that at the present time there are 508 children attending the Sackett Street School and, of this number, 78 live in the area bounded by Sackett Street, Niagara Street, Detroit Avenue and Broad Street, and who must cross Sackett Street going to and from school. The most convenient place for them to cross Sackett Street is at Niagara Street. This is a wide open intersection and if ordinary precaution is exercised there is no danger in crossing the street.

Capt. Kelly states that this intersection is a block away from the school and it is not practicable to install a school boy patrol so far away from the school. There are in operation, three school boy patrols at the Sackett Street School; Sackett and Hamilton Streets, Hamilton and Warrington Streets and Sackett and Melrose Streets.

Capt. Kelly states that he cannot recommend the location, Sackett and Niagara Streets, to be considered for the placement of either a patrolman or a Crossing Guard and I am in agreement with him. In addition we have no one available to take care of the above crossing at this time.
