Dear Sir:

Please be advised that under City Council Resolution No. 127, dated February 27, 1975, the Department of Building Inspection ordered Mr. Levine to remove all junk cars, debris, etc. from his service station located at 584 Cranston Street.

We also wrote to the License Bureau informing them that there were oil trucks parked on the premises, used motors, and other automobile parts.

Therefore, we requested that the License Bureau revoke their Petroleum Products License.

The License Bureau notified Mr. Levine to appear before the Bureau on Monday, April 14, 1975 for a hearing pertaining to a violation of the City Ordinances governing the storage of petroleum products.

The Department of Building Inspection made several inspections of the premises, and on April 11, 1975 the service station had removed the oil trucks, the junk auto parts, and the station was in excellent condition.

At the hearing before the License Bureau on April 14, 1975 I reported to the Bureau that Mr. Levine had complied with our order in cleaning the station and we hoped that it would be kept in this manner.
