Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 474 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved May 7, 1951, entitled, "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting an Official Redevelopment Plan for the Point Street Project Area D2-R" on Plan Controls for Land Use and Parking.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

1. That Chapter 474 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved May 7, 1951, entitled, "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting an Official Redevelopment Plan for the Point Street Project Area D2-R", as amended by Chapter 1230 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved September 19, 1958, be and the same is hereby amended as follows:

A. The entire Section A. entitled, "Land Use and Buildings" under Chapter II, entitled "General Provisions of the Plan" as contained in and set forth in pages 2 to 5 of that certain booklet entitled, "Redevelopment Plan, Point Street" which is a part of the aforementioned ordinance be and the same is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefore:

Section A. Land Use and Building Requirements

a. M-1 General Industrial Zone

(1) Permitted Uses

(a) M-1 General Industrial Uses of the Zoning Ordinance shall be permitted.

(2) Development Controls

(a) Building Height, Building Setback, Land Coverage, Yards, Parking, Loading and Screening shall be governed by the applicable provisions of the Zoning Ordinance.

2. That said Chapter 474 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence as adopted and as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby ratified and affirmed in all other respects.

3. That this Ordinance shall take effect on its passage and shall be filed with the City Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy thereof to the Providence Redevelopment Agency.

An Ordinance in Amendment of and in Addition to Chapter 15, Section 15-2 of the Code of Ordinances entitled, "Motor Vehicles and Traffic".

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Section 15-2 of Chapter 15, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Sec. 15-2. Penalties for traffic violations.”

(a) Generally. The general penalties provided for by section 1-10 of this Code of Ordinances shall apply to violations of this chapter or any regulations made thereunder except that any person electing to appear before the clerk of court, or mailing the same, in lieu of a personal appearance before the Providence Municipal Court and admitting the violation charged, shall be punished by a fine as hereinafter respectively set forth:

Violation of moving vehicle traffic regulation 50.00

In the event any of the foregoing stated fines are not paid or a plea of not guilty to the citation is entered prior to the fourteenth day after date of violation, said fines shall be doubled.

In the event any of the foregoing stated fines are not paid or a plea of not guilty to the citation is entered subsequent to the fourteenth day and prior to the twenty-eighth day after date of violations, said fines shall be tripled.

(b) Meter violations. Where overtime parking shall occur in a metered space it shall be a separate violation for vehicles remained parked in said space for each consecutive unit of time beyond the first unit of time, up to a maximum of two (2) violations.”

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

An Ordinance setting fee schedules for new construction, alteration, demolition or other building operations pursuant to Title 23, Section 27.3-118.0.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1: In accordance with Section 118.0, Fees, of Title 23-27.3, of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, as amended, the Rhode Island Building Code, the schedule of permit fees as contained hereunder shall apply to all permits issued for the alterations, maintenance, repair of any building, sign, marquee, or other structure, including the installation of plumbing, electrical, heating, ventilating, air conditioning, refrigeration, or any other mechanical equipment that comes within the purview of the Rhode Island State Building Code, and the replacement of gasoline pumps and storage tanks, except as may be otherwise specified herein.

Section 2: Plan Review Fee

A plan review fee shall be paid whenever any application for a building permit is made for work valued at \$50,000 or more. This fee shall be equal to one third (1/3) of the permit fee calculated in accordance with the Schedule of Permit Fees listed in Section 1 of this Ordinance, but in no case shall such fee exceed \$1,000.00. Whenever more than one plan review is required, either because of a substantial change in the original plans submitted, a substantial delay by the owner in obtaining a building permit, or some other reason, the Director may charge an additional plan review fee. At the time of the issuance of the building permit, the fee paid for plan review will be applied towards the amount of the final building permit fee. When more than one plan review fee has been paid, only one fee shall be applied towards the payment of the permit fee.

Section 3: Permit Fees for Cleaning the Exterior of Buildings.

The fee for the cleaning of buildings by sandblasting or by steam or acid, or any other process, shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

Section 4: Permit Fees for Obstructing Highways during Construction.

The fee for obstructing highways during the construction of buildings or other structures shall be based upon the area of the highway obstructed and shall be at the rate of four cents (\$0.04) per square foot of such area for each week or fraction

thereof that the highway is obstructed. The minimum fee, however, shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Section 5: Permit Fees for Demolition

The fee for the demolition of buildings or other structures shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for a building, two (2) stories or less in height, and twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for each story over two (2) stories in height.

Section 6: Permit Fees for moving buildings or other structures

The fee for the moving of buildings or other structures shall be as follows:

If relocated so as not to involve the use of public highways in the process of moving \$ 50.00

If relocating involves the use of public highways \$150.00

Section 7: Fees for a Certificate of Occupancy

Fees for a "Certificate of Occupancy" shall be as follows:

For new buildings or other new structures \$ 25.00

For existing buildings or other structures for which there is a change of occupancy or substantial restoration being made under active valid building permit \$ 50.00

For existing buildings or other structures for which no active building permit has been issued \$100.00

Section 8: Fees for Annual Inspections

The fees for annual inspections performed in accordance with Section 108.15 of the Rhode Island State Building Code or performed at the request of the Providence Bureau of Licenses prior to license issuances or renewals shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00) for each division making an inspection of the premises.

Section 9: Licenses

The following fees shall apply to all licenses and renewals issued by the Mechanical Equipment and Installations Division:

Section 10: Appeals to the Providence Building Board of Review

The fee for an application to the Providence Building Board of Review shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Section 11: Working without a Building Permit

A fee of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00), in addition to the fees outlined herein, shall be charged whenever any work is performed without a building permit or whenever the terms of any permit are exceeded.

Section 12: Fees not otherwise classified

If a fee is not specifically provided for in this Ordinance, a reasonable fee shall be set by the

Director of the Department of Inspection and Standards.

Section 13: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
