RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 37

Approved January 30, 1978

WHEREAS, On February 17, 1977, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 107, approved by the Mayor on February 25, 1977, authorizing the Board of Contract and Supply to acquire Lots 84, 85, 86, 87, 182 and 183 on City Assessor's Plat 36, for the Renovation of the Asa Messer School, thereby ratifying the Action of the Board of Contract and Supply taken February 7, 1977, and

WHEREAS, On November 3, 1977, Resolution No. 703 was adopted by the City Council, approved by the Mayor on November 11, 1977, authorizing the acquisition of Lots 952, 953 and 954 on City Assessor's Plat 43, for Playground Purposes at the Vineyard Street School and for the Renovation and New Construction of said School, ratifying the Action of the Board of Contract and Supply taken July 12, 1976,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That His Honor Mayor Vincent A. Cianci, Jr., is requested to report back to the City Council as to the present status of acquiring said lots, as specified, so that Construction and Renovation of the Asa Messer School and the Vineyard Street School will commence.
