



Gentlemen:

As you know we continually receive many requests for "Slow-Children" signs. In order to preserve any effectiveness what-so-ever to this general type of sign, we have limited its use to three specific categories. These are:

- 1) Slow-School
- 2) Slow-Playground
- 3) School Crossing

It is our practice to use these signs wherever the sign is appropriate in relation to a private or public school or a playground. The school crossing signs are used near intersections one or two blocks away from the school-where the school building cannot be seen from the street being used but where concentrations of children are expected to use certain marked crosswalks in going to or from school.

In view of the number of schools, playgrounds and school crossing locations scattered throughout the city any further dilution of this general type of signing will seriously detract from the limited effectiveness of the present type of signing. Therefore, we do not recommend the installation of any Slow-Children signs on River Avenue, Lawn Street and Bolton Avenue.


As you know we continually receive many requests for "Slow-Children" signs. In order to preserve any effectiveness what-so-ever to this general type of sign, we have limited its use to three specific categories. These are:


Gentlemen:

We have completed our investigation of your request for "Stop For Pedestrian" signs and painted crosswalks on Hartford Avenue at Hilarity Street.

It is our policy to restrict the use of the "Stop For Pedestrian" signs to those locations where there is an unusually high volume of pedestrian traffic, in order to preserve their effectiveness. Since our study showed a minor volume of pedestrian traffic at this intersection, we do not recommend the installation of these signs.

However, this location has been on our crosswalk painting list since 1957, and will continue to be painted regularly as a part of our regular schedule. The last date these crosswalks were painted was June 26, 1964.


Gentlemen:

Accordingly, we do not recommend the installation of control signs at this intersection.




Gentlemen:

Our study showed very light traffic volumes on both streets. In addition, there have been only three reported accidents at this location in the past fifteen years as far back as our records go and none since 1958.




Gentlemen:

We have completed our investigation of the request for "Stop" control at the intersections of Dorchester Avenue with Rye Street, Ralph Street, Viola Street and Deborah Street.

Our study shows that all of these locations are "T" intersections with minor volumes of traffic. The accident history of each of these locations is good. In the past fifteen years, as far back as our records go, there have been only two reported accidents at Dorchester Avenue and Rye Street, one reported accident at Dorchester Avenue and Ralph Street, no reported accidents at Dorchester Avenue and Viola Street, and one reported accident at Dorchester Avenue and Deborah Street.

In view of the existing good operation of these intersections we do not recommend that control signs be installed.




Gentlemen:

We have completed our investigation of your request for the installation of painted crosswalks at 710 North Main Street.

There are existing painted crosswalks at the intersection of North Main Street and Jenkins Street, approximately 240 feet north of this location, and at the intersection of Pleasant Street and North Main Street, approximately 150 feet south of this location.

Because of the close proximity of these existing crosswalks to the location of the requested crosswalks, the heavy traffic at this location, and the difficulty in alerting motorists to the presence of a mid-block crosswalk, we do not recommend the installation of this crosswalk.






