In response to City Council Resolution No. 792, dated September 14, 1979, requesting the Director of the Department of Building Inspection to investigate zoning violations along Huldah and Judith Streets, please be advised that this area is almost entirely zoned M-1 and also has a number of legal non-conforming uses for laundries, junk yards, and a gas station.

It is very difficult for me to determine the specific violation of the Zoning Ordinance the City Council is concerned with, since the M-1 zoning permits almost any use that is allowed within the City except for extremely heavy industrial uses.

I would appreciate receiving a more specific request so that I may act upon it.
