Whereas, the existing Model 6450 Prime computer system of the City of Providence is in need of upgrading in order to service the ever increasing demands for computer operations, thereby developing and obtaining a data processing plan whereby management will be able to efficiently and effectively manage the City's indispensable information requirement; and

An Ordinance in Amendment of Chapter 1991-24, as approved July 24, 1991, entitled: "An Ordinance Establishing a Compensation Plan for the City of Providence and Repealing Ordinance Chapter 1990-13, approved July 3, 1990, as Amended" relative to various City Departments, as amended.

Whereas, after due advertising and bidding procedures, Infocel, Inc. has rendered a proposal, entitled: Project Northern Star, to supply a computer turnkey computer system to the City of Providence which will include (i) an upgrade to the current Prime 6450 to the Prime 6650 initially, and then a subsequent upgrade to Prime 5540 or equivalent system, (ii) the supply of standard municipal government application software,

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

system software on-site implementation assistance, and (iii) the installation of a Motorola 8640 quid processor computer system into the Providence Police Department to service the city-wide public safety requirements for Computer Aided Dispatching and Police Records Management; and

Whereas, such proposal of Infocel, Inc. sets out a purchase price of \$1,943,429.00 (a summary of which is set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto, and expressly made a part hereof by reference, and a detailed cost being set forth in Chapter 11 of the proposal of Infocel, Inc. a copy of which is furnished and available for inspection) to be financed over a five year term, for a total sum of \$2,500,000.00 with amortized payments beginning in July 1992, and which said total cost includes a buyout of the current computer lease obligation of \$234,494.00; and

Whereas, the Board of Contract and Supply has duly reviewed and approved the purchase of the items and installation of Project Northern Star as set forth in the lease financing arrangements of the said proposal of Infocel, Inc.; and

Whereas, the City Controller has certified that there are sufficient uncommitted funds from the current capital equipment budget to purchase the items in the said proposal, said certification being attached hereto as Exhibit B, and incorporated herein by reference.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. The within Ordinance shall be deemed a computer equipment ordinance in compliance with, and pursuant to, the provisions of Chapter 21, Section 21-19 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence for the upgrading of the current computer system.

Section 2. The items to be purchased for each department and the estimated cost of each item are attached hereto as Exhibit A, and expressly made a part hereof by reference, and by reference to Chapter 11 of the proposal of Infocel, Inc.

Section 3. The upgrading of the current computer system of the City of Providence by Infocel, Inc., and as previously reviewed and approved by the Board of Contract and Supply, be and the same is hereby approved, and such upgrading shall not require any additional expenditure for the fiscal year 1991-1992 as originally approved by the City Council for the budgetary expenditure for such fiscal year.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
