Approved September 10, 1970

Whereas, Section 117 of the Housing Act of 1949, as amended, authorizes the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development to make grants to municipalities and counties to assist them in carrying out programs of concentrated code enforcement in deteriorated or deteriorating areas in which such enforcement, together with certain public improvements to be provided by the locality, may be expected to arrest the decline of the area,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PROVIDENCE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE,

That the Director of the Department of Planning and Urban Development be authorized to prepare an application for such Federal assistance for that portion of the Elmwood area of the City bounded by Public Street, Broad Street, Lexington Avenue and Elmwood Avenue, said application to be prepared within the context of Federal regulations and the terms of the Act.

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 320

Approved September 10, 1970

RESOLVED, That His Honor the Mayor be and he hereby is authorized to execute a lease from Joyce M. Gomes of that parcel of land situated at 388 Prairie Avenue, in the City of Providence, being designated as Lot No. 621 on City Assessor's Plat 48, including a portion of the first floor, a portion of the cellar and two stalls of the garage; said lease to be for a period of one (1) year, at an annual rental of TWENTY-ONE HUNDRED (\$2100) DOLLARS, with an option to renew for the succeeding one (1) year, and to contain such terms and conditions as may be approved by His Honor the Mayor and the City Solicitor.

The purpose of this lease is to establish a community service officer program under the Mayor's Committee on Crime in the City of Providence to be administered by the Providence Police Department under the direction of Lt. Manuel Rodrigues. The Providence Police

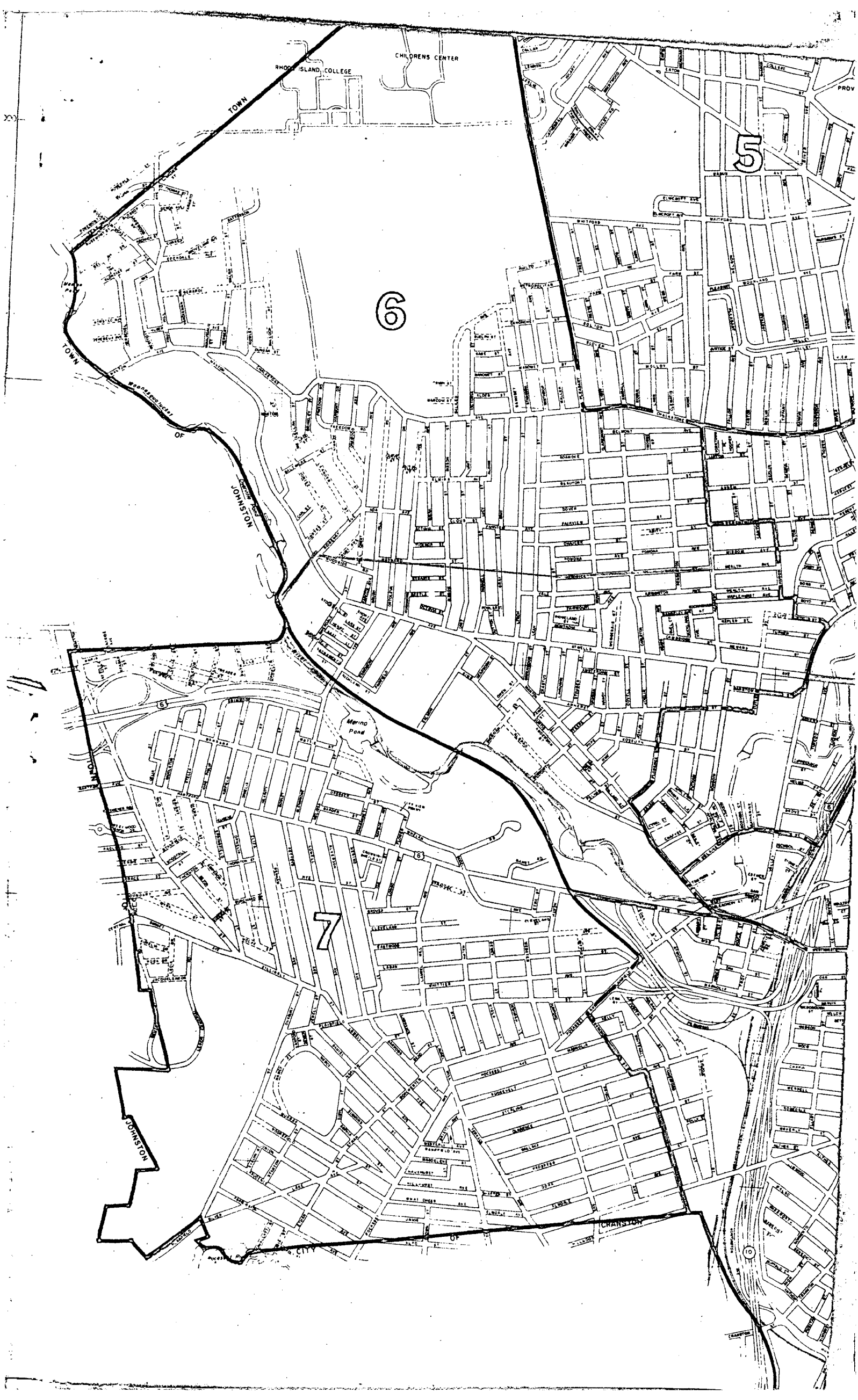
