

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1           SECTION 1. Section 45-6-2 of the General Laws in Chapter 45-6  
2   entitled "Ordinances" is hereby amended to read as follows:  
3           45-6-2. Imposition of penalties for ordinance violations. --  
4   They may impose penalties for the violation of such ordinances and  
5   regulations, not exceeding in amount one-hundred-dollars-(\$100) two  
6   thousand, five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or imprisonment not exceeding  
7   thirty-(30)-days one (1) year in some jail or house of correction, for  
8   any one (1) offense, or both for each violation unless other penalties  
9   therefor, or penalties within other limits, are specially prescribed  
10   by statute, to be prosecuted by some officer appointed for that pur-  
11   pose, and to be recovered to the use of the town, or of such person or  
12   persons, and in such proportions, as they in their said ordinances and  
13   regulations shall designate.

1           SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
