




which requires the State Registry of motor vehicles to suspend the registration of any vehicle which has amassed over \$200 dollars in parking violations.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 31-3-5 of the General Laws in Chapter 31-3
2 entitled "Registration of Vehicles" is hereby amended to read as fol-
3 lows:

4 31-3-5. Grounds for refusal of registration. -- The registry
5 shall refuse registration or any transfer of registration upon any of
6 the following grounds:

7 (a) That the application contains any false or fraudulent state-
8 ment or that the applicant has failed to furnish required information
9 or reasonable additional information requested by the registry or that
10 the applicant is not entitled to the issuance of registration of the
11 vehicle under chapters 3 to 9, inclusive, of this title.

12 (b) That the vehicle is mechanically unfit or unsafe to be oper-
13 ated upon the highways.

1 (c) That the registry has reasonable ground to believe that the
2 vehicle is a stolen or embezzled vehicle or that the granting of
3 registration would constitute a fraud against the rightful owner.

4 (d) That the registration of the vehicle stands suspended or
5 revoked for any reason as provided in the motor vehicle laws of this
6 state.

7 (e) That the vehicle has been reported by any city or town to the
8 registry as having unpaid fines in the aggregate amount of two hundred
9 dollars (\$200.00) or more; provided, said registration shall be issued
10 upon presentation of proof of payment of the outstanding fines owed to
11 the cities or towns reporting said unpaid fines. Said sum of two hun-
12 dred dollars (\$200.00) shall represent the aggregate value of the sum
13 of the fines on the face of the ticket(s) or summons(es) and shall not
14 include interest, penalties or any other monetary amount which may be
15 imposed for failure to pay said ticket(s) or summons(es) by a speci-
16 fied date. Before the registry shall deny a registration to any
17 person pursuant to this subsection, the registry shall have first
18 received a five dollar fee (\$5.00) for each request from the city or
19 town requesting the denial of registration, which fee may be added to
20 the aggregate value of the sum of the fines.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.







It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. 31-43-5.1 of The General Laws of Rhode Island entitled "Mandatory fines and suspensions" is hereby amended as follows:

In addition to any other penalties provided by law, a commissioner shall impose the following mandatory penalties for speeding:

A) For speeds up to an excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour over the posted speed limit on public highways, a fine as provided for in 31-41-4 for the first offense, ~~ten dollars (\$10.00)~~ twelve dollars (\$12.00) per mile, two dollars of which will be paid to the city or town issuing the summons, for each mile in excess of the speed limit for the second offense if within twelve (12) months of the first offense and ~~fifteen dollars (\$15.00)~~ seventeen dollars (\$17.00) per mile, two dollars (\$2.00) of wich will be paid to the city or town issuing the summons, for each mile in excess of the speed limit for the third and subsequent offense if within twelve (12) months of the first offense. In addition the license may be suspended up to thirty (30) days.

3) For speeds in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour over the posted speed limit on public highways, a mandatory fine of ~~ten dollars (\$10.00)~~ twelve dollars (\$12.00) per mile, two dollars (\$2.00) of which will be paid to the city or town issuing the summons, for each mile over the speed limit for the first offense,

fifteen dollars. (~~\$15.00~~) seventeen dollars (\$17.00) per mile, two dollars (\$2.00) of which will be paid to the city or town issuing the summons, for each mile in excess of the speed limit for the second offense if within twelve (12) months of the first offense, and ~~twenty dollars (\$20.00)~~ twenty two dollars (\$22.00) per mile, two dollars of which will be paid to the city or town issuing the summons, for each mile in excess of the speed limit for the third and subsequent offense if within twelve (12) months of the first offense. In addition, the license may be suspended up to sixty (60) days.

SECTION 2 This Act shall take effect upon passage

EXPLANATION

This act increase the fine for speeding by two dollars (\$2.00) per mile and returns the increase to the city or town issuing the summons







It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The department of environmental management by and
2 through its director, shall reimburse the city of Providence by and
3 through its treasurer, fifty (50%) percent of the cost of the opera-
4 tion, care, and maintenance of Roger Williams Park. Such reimburse-
5 ment shall include, but not be limited to the cost of personnel who
6 are utilized to maintain Roger Williams Park, the operational cost of
7 the zoo, the casino, the museum, and the maintenance cost for the
8 roads within the park. Upon receipt from the mayor of the city of
9 Providence of a statement of the comptroller of the city of Providence
10 as to the amounts of monies expended to Roger Williams Park in the
11 previous fiscal year, the department of environmental management by
12 and through the comptroller and director of the state of Rhode Island
13 shall reimburse fifty (50%) percent of the amount presented within
14 ninety (90) days of presentation. Reimbursement for the fiscal year

1 87-88 shall be based upon expenditures in the fiscal year 1985-1986

2 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1987
