





Dear Mr. Clarkin:

The Freshman Orientation Program and the return of undergraduate students at Brown University begins on Tuesday, September 1, 1998 and ends with the Opening Convocation on Tuesday, September 8, 1998 the first day of classes.

**September 1/2, 1998**

With the majority of students arriving on September 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>, I am requesting approval for the following traffic patterns and postings on those dates to deal with congestion around the University area. Additionally, I would request that parking restrictions/tagging be lifted on most streets adjacent to the campus during this two day period.

**Wriston/Keeney Quad Areas:**

1. George Street one-way east from Magee Street to Thayer Street
2. Charlesfield Street one-way west from Thayer to Brown Street
3. Benevolent Street one-way east from Magee to Brown Street
4. Brown Street one-way north from Charlesfield to George Street
5. Post and enforce "NO PARKING/EMERGENCY TOW ZONE" on the west side of Magee Street from George to Benevolent St.

**Pembroke Area:**

1. Bowen Street one-way east from Brown Street to Thayer Street
2. Post and enforce "NO PARKING/EMERGENCY TOW ZONE" on both sides of Bowen Street from Thayer to Brown Street.
3. Post and enforce "NO PARKING/EMERGENCY TOW ZONE" on the north side of Meeting Street.

**Perkins/Young Orchard Area:**

1. Power Street one-way east from Hope Street to Cooke Street
2. Cooke Street one-way north from Power Street to Young Orchard Avenue
3. Young Orchard Avenue one-way west from Cooke Street to Hope Street
4. Post and enforce "NO PARKING/EMERGENCY TOW ZONE" on both sides of Power Street, Cooke Street, and Young Orchard Avenue

These traffic patterns should be established by 0600 on Tuesday, September 1 and end by 1800 on Wednesday, September 2, 1998. We will have a Providence Police detail at the following control points, in addition to our Brown University officers from 0700-1800 on these two dates:

1. One (1) PPD officer at Brown & George Streets
2. One (1) PPD officer at George & Thayer Streets
3. One (1) PPD officer at Benevolent & Brown Streets
4. One (1) PPD officer at Charlesfield and Brown Streets
5. One (1) PPD officer at Power & Cooke Street
6. One (1) PPD officer at Thayer & Bowen Street
7. One (1) PPD officer at Young Orchard Avenue & Hope Street

**September 8, 1998**

On Tuesday, September 8, the Opening Convocation will be held. In order to facilitate the safe movement of students on College Street from Benefit Street east through the Van Wickle Gates onto the College Green, I am requesting permission to block off vehicular traffic to the following streets between 1045-1145 with police officers from this department working control points to handle traffic:

1. College Street from Benefit east to the VanWickle Gates at Prospect Street
2. Prospect Street from Waterman to George Street.




