## M I N U T E

Thomas S. Luongo, was, to the time of his passing, a life long resident of the City of Providence, Rhode Island where he was born December 13, 1893, where he married, and with his devoted wife, raised their family.

His formal education was taken in its public schools, which preceded varied careers in personally owned and operated business enterprises.

"Tom" Luongo's political career started with his election to the Common Council, in 1926, followed by successive elections to the Board of Aldermen and to the legislative body that succeeded, the City Council, where he has honored by his colleagues who elected him as its President for two terms, during which he often acted as Mayor.

It was during this period of the greater part of his adult life that the name "Tom" Luongo became legendary.

His political triumphs coincided with the termination of the era of a great depression and the advent of the National New Deal movement, when of necessity, none but those that had fortitude attracted the confidence of voters; survived the hard fought political campaigns; mended injured feelings and truly represented the interests of the area from which he was elected.

This was the motivating spirit of the "fighting Councilman from the Thirteenth Ward of Providence", this was the same spirit that often brought criticism to his "modus operandi", and this was the pattern that was responsible for thirty five years of almost continuous

confidence that the electorate from the area, composed of many ethnic Americans, bestowed upon him.

His record of accomplishments will serve as indelible reminders of an era of the evolution of politics, American style.

2.2. Mr. Luongo's demands in life were simple, he was most "at home" with his constituency and infrequently left this environment, for its problems.

It can truly be stated that the beneficence of this man far exceeded his other characteristics.

Succeeding generations in this City, and certainly of the Federal Hill area, will know of the legend that was Thomas S. Luongo, devoted husband and father, American, by birth and choice, partisan Democratic office holder, religious, civic, cultural and social leader.
