Resolved,

That permission be and hereby is granted to Brown University in Providence in the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations, a corporation created and existing under the laws of the State of Rhode Island to construct, install and maintain an underground conduit to be used for the purpose of conveying steam, electric and telephone lines under and across Thayer and Manning Streets, in the City of Providence, all in accordance with the accompanying plan attached hereto, entitled "Key Plat Plan Brown University High Voltage Electrical Distribution", as approved by the City Engineer of the City of Providence, and the Public Service Engineer, and in accordance with the provisions of "An Act Authorizing the City of Providence to Permit the Owner or Owners of Estates Situated upon Opposite Sides of a Street or highway to Build and Maintain a Subway, Conduit or Pipe under or across Such Street or Highway," being Chapter 1418 of the Public Laws, approved April 4, 1916.

The permission hereby granted is upon the condition that said underground conduits shall be so constructed as not to interfere with the use of said Thayer and Manning Streets, by the public or by any person or corporations having the right to maintain pipes or conduits under or in said street; and it is further provided that the permission hereby granted is upon the condition that said underground conduits for steam, electric and

telephone lines shall be constructed under the supervision and control, and to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Works, and upon the condition that said underground conduits, shall be removed upon 90 (ninety) days' previous notice from the City Council whenever in the opinion of said City Council the public interest may require the removal of the same or any part thereof; and upon the condition that in case the City of Providence shall at any time hereafter be authorized to assess abutting owners for the private use and occupation of the public highway, the passage of this Resolution shall not in any manner affect the right of the City to charge and collect rent for the use of said Thayer and Manning Streets by said Brown University, its successors and assigns, or for maintaining thereunder said underground conduits for steam pipes, electric and telephone lines and upon condition that said Brown University, its successors and assigns, shall hold and keep said City of Providence harmless, safe and indemnified from and against all loss, cost, damage, payment and expense on account of any injuries to persons, or damage to property, for which said City may become liable on account of the construction, maintenance, use or repair, or neglect to properly maintain or repair, or any defect of said underground tunnel or conduit, pipes, wires, or other facility for steam, electric and telephone conduits under and across Thayer and Manning Streets, unless the wrongful act or negligence of said City, its officers or employees, shall cause such injury or damage as mentioned aforesaid; and upon condition that said Brown University, its successors and assigns before commencing the work of constructing said conduits file a bond in the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars, in form satisfactory to the City Solicitor to hold and keep said City harmless, safe and endemnified as aforesaid,





RE: Resolution dated Feb. 16, 1961 requesting the Director of Public Works to consider and if deemed feasible to cause the collection of household rubbish to be made from respective properties rather than on the sidewalks.

Dear Sir:

Prior to the inauguration of the refuse collection system in the City of Providence, this Department conducted a survey of the facilities used and the method of collection of refuse in several of the larger cities throughout New England and New York State. Most of these cities collected refuse from the curb.

At the time the survey was made, refuse was collected from private property in Springfield, Massachusetts and in two densely populated sections of Boston, while curb collections were made in all other areas of Boston.

The City of Springfield changed to curb collections on April 3, 1961 and Mr. John D. McDonald, Engineer with the Board of Public Works, advised us that the saving to the City should be reflected in a reduction of approximately \$1.50 per thousand in the tax rate.

A change to curb collections in the two sections of Boston was made on April 1, 1961 and Mr. James W. Haley, Commissioner of Public Works advised us that the change will save the City of Boston in excess of \$100,000.00.

The American Public Works Association made a study of various methods of collecting refuse and a report thereon was published in 1958. Excerpts from this report follows:

"The advantages of loading containers from curbs or alleys lie mainly in the rapidity of making collections, with resulting lower costs. It requires the householder to do part of the work and to put up with some inconvenience to compensate for the reduced expense. However, it eliminates a number of variables, and the amount of service given each householder is more uniform."

"The major disadvantage of collecting refuse from yards is the increased cost of collection. Various estimates place the additional expense at 25 to 50 per cent over the amount needed for regular curb or alley collection. Some officials believe that the fact that the collectors must enter private property is a drawback because of the danger of being bitten by dogs and because of charges by householders that collectors steal from the premises."

The City of Providence method of collecting non combustible refuse from the curb is the same method in use in New York, Philadelphia, Norfolk, St. Louis, Louisville, San Diego, Los Angeles and many other municipalities throughout the country.

The American Public Works Association report showed that curb collections in most cities consisted of non-combustible refuse, while yard collections consisted of combined garbage and refuse.

Since we are concerned with the collection of non-combustible refuse only, it is my opinion that our present method of collection is very satisfactory and should be continued.
