

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 402

Approved July 12, 1974

Whereas, the recent slaying of Mrs. Martin Luther King, Sr. appalled all who were familiar with the Civil Rights movement of her distinguished husband and son in the service to humanity, and

Whereas, a devout member of her religious beliefs, Mrs. King had carved a nitch in the history of Civil Rights, in her own right and,

Whereas the untimely death of a devoted disciple of right, leaves a void that shall be dedicated to her religious principles,

Now, Therefore Be it Resolved that in memory of her passing, his Honor, Mayor Joseph A. Doorley and the Members of the City Council for themselves and the Citizens of the City of Providence, Rhode Island, hereby expresses to her bereaved husband, Reverend Martin Luther King, Sr., their heartfelt sympathy in her passing, her sacrifice for all Civil Rights proposals and pause in its deliberations noting the contributes she has left behind as an indelible monument to her rights movement and that of her most respected family, and

Be It Furthur Resolved that the City Clerk is directed to cause a duly engrossed copy of this Resolution to be transferred to Reverend Martin Luther King, Sr., that he be appraised of the respect accorded to her memory by the Citizens of the City of Providence, Rhode Island.
