

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 75

Approved February 23, 2022

WHEREAS, Thomas Spann was a standout two-sport student-athlete at the University of Rhode Island (URI) and a valuable member of the football team between 1975-1977; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Spann was also a four-year letter winner in track and field; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Spann was an Assistant Football Coach at South Kingstown High and Head Girls Track Coach at North Kingstown High; and

WHEREAS, Since his graduation from URI in 1978, Thomas Spann has relentlessly worked to transmit his love of sports by serving as a coach and mentor at Hope High School and Johnson and Wales University and was named Coach of the Year 11 times; and

WHEREAS, Coach Thomas Spann is a Hall of Fame member for the Rhode Island Interscholastic League and the Rhode Island Track Coaches Association; and

WHEREAS, Coach Thomas Spann received the honor of serving as a member of the 1996 Olympic Torch Relay Team; and

WHEREAS, He is a dedicated public servant who has served the City of Providence in the Recreation Department for many years and is the recipient of the 2011 Ben Mondor Community Service Award by Words Unlimited which honors Rhode Island's top athletes and coaches; and

WHEREAS, In 2014 Coach Thomas Spann was the New Balance National Coach of the Year; and

WHEREAS, Coach Thomas Spann's athletes have set forty-seven (47) records with sixteen (16) still standing; and

WHEREAS, Coach Spann's desire to share his passion led him to create the Providence Cobras youth track club, helping athletes of all skill levels from Providence and beyond in various sports of track and field grow and reach their full potential; and




Dear Councilwoman Harris and Members of the Urban Redevelopment, Renewal and Planning Committee,


I am writing to express my support of the Resolution to name Hope High School Track after Coach Thomas Spann.
