Resolved,

That

the City Council of the City of Providence hereby orders the assessment and collection of a tax on the ratable real estate and tangible personal property and ratable intangible personal property (the tax on ratable intangible property to be at the rate of forty cents on each one hundred dollars of the value thereof) in a sum not less than \$21,400,000.00 nor more than \$21,900,000.00; said tax is for ordinary expenses, charges and sinking funds, for the payment of interest and indebtedness in whole or in part of said City, and for other purposes authorized by law.

The City Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on the inhabitants and ratable property of said City as of the 31st day of December, A.D. 1954, at twelve o'clock noon, Eastern Standard Time, according to law, and shall, on completion of said assessment, date and sign the same, and shall make out and certify to the City Collector of the City of Providence, on or before the 15th day of June, A.D. 1955, a complete list of the names of the persons taxed and of the total value of all the real estate taxed to each person, also the amount of personal estate assessed against each person, and also the total amount of the tax assessed against each person on said real estate and personal estate, opposite the name of the person or persons assessed, the assessment of real estate and of personal estate to appear in separate columns in said list. Said tax shall be due and payable on and between the 1st day of October, next and the twenty-fourth day of October, A.D. 1955, next, and all taxes remaining unpaid on said last named day shall carry until collected a penalty at the rate of eight per centum per annum upon such unpaid taxes. Provided, however, said tax may be paid in four installments, the first installment of twenty-five per centum on or before the Twenty-Fourth day of October, A.D. 1955, and the remaining installments as follows: Twenty-five per centum on the twenty-fourth day of January, A.D. 1956; twenty-five per centum on the twenty-fourth day of April, A.D. 1956; and twenty-five per centum on the twenty-fourth day of July, A.D. 1956. Each installment of taxes, if paid on

or before the last day of each installment period successively and in order, shall be free from any charge for interest. If the first installment or any succeeding installment of taxes is not paid by the last date of the respective installment period or periods as they occur, then the whole tax or ~~remaining~~ unpaid balance of the tax, as the case may be, shall immediately become due and payable and shall carry until collected a penalty at the rate of eight per centum per annum. The City Collector shall, by advertisement, in the public newspapers of the City, ~~motify~~ all persons assessed to pay their respective taxes at his office on and between the said 1st and twenty-fourth days of October, A.D. 1955, both days inclusive; said Collector shall attend daily during said periods, Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays excepted, at his office from nine O'clock A.M. to five o'clock P.M. to receive said taxes.

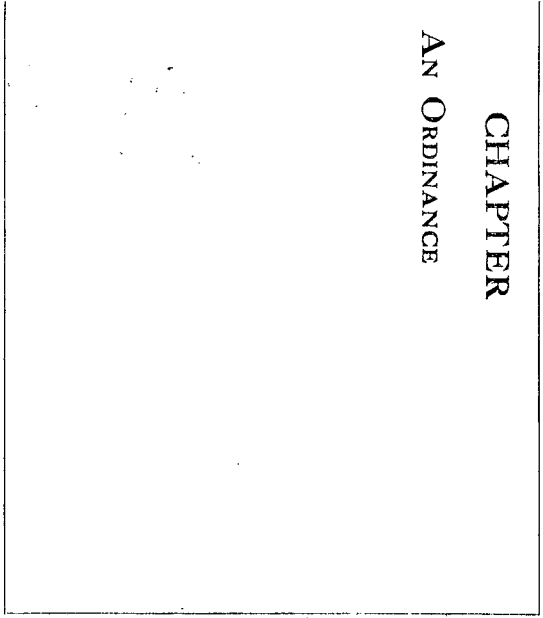

Approved April 22, 1955

Resolved,

That the sum of Six Hundred (\$600.00) Dollars is hereby ordered transferred by the Board of Commissioners of Sinking Funds from the "Fire Insurance Fund" established by Section 38 of Chapter 2 of the Revised Ordinances of 1946 entitled "Fire Insurance Fund" to a separate account in the Capital Fund to be known as, "Federal Hill Pool Recreation Center Fire Damage Fund".

Said sum or so much thereof as may be necessary shall be expended in the rebuilding or repairing and replacing damaged equipment at the Federal Hill Pool Recreation Center, said building having been damaged by fire. Any balance remaining in said fund at the completion of the work shall revert to the "Fire Insurance Fund".


**SUBJECT: REFERRAL NO. 704 - REDEMPTION OF LOT 20 ON ASSESSORS PLAT






