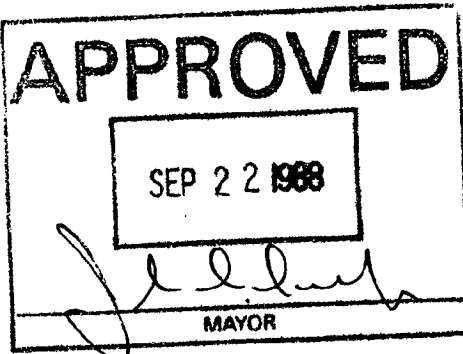

WHEREAS, Broad Street in the area indicated above suffers from extreme blight, and

WHEREAS, Broad Street was once a thriving business district, and

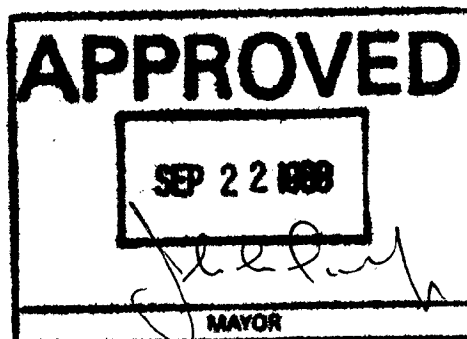
WHEREAS, there are many fine ethnic shops and restaurants along Broad Street, which could attract customers from throughout the state and region, if the appearance of Broad Street were enhanced to highlight these establishments,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Providence Redevelopment Agency in conjunction with the Providence Urban Development staff and City Councilmen from the area work with existing business owners and neighborhood residents to form a Project Area Committee to begin planning and locating financing for a complete redevelopment of that area capitalizing and enhancing on the ethnic flavor of the existing business district.
