ORDINANCES SECOND READING

The following Ordinance was in City Council October 6, 1994, Read and Passed the First Time and is Returned for Passage the Second Time:

An Ordinance Establishing a Tax Stabilization for OAR Tool and Die, Inc.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Whereas, Section 21-160 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence grants authority to the City Council, pursuant to Section 44-3-9 of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island, as amended, to exempt property used for industrial purposes from the payment of property tax if the granting of exemption meets certain conditions as set forth in said section of the ordinance; and

Whereas, OAR Tool and Die, Inc. has made application under and has satisfied each condition of the above mentioned ordinance; and

Whereas, OAR Tool and Die, Inc. has renovated the facilities; and

Whereas, It is in the interest of the residents of the City of Providence to grant such an exemption;

Now therefore, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Providence, Rhode Island, as follows:

Section 1. That the findings set forth in the preceeding *Whereas* Clauses are hereby made and confirmed.

Section 1. The aforescribed Compensation Plan is hereby adopted for all City Officers and employees and shall be applied to each, except as hereinafter described.

In order to provide for periodic increases, each position is categorized as one (1) of thirty-five (35) "Pay Grades", each of which contains five (5) steps.

Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, any and all employees in the Office of the Mayor shall be excepted from any salary established herein so long as the total of the compensation for such employees does not exceed the annual budget appropriation for personnel services in the Office of the Mayor.

Section 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, the compensation for positions approved by the Salary Review Board and legal assistants to the City Solicitor shall be

no greater than those herein specified; however, any department head or legal assistant to the City Solicitor may be compensated at a rate lower than that established herein, and that lower compensation shall be allowed by this Ordinance. For all positions with salary range provisions, the actual compensation shall be as listed in the personnel supplement

Section 4. No member of a collective bargaining union shall receive an increase in compensation above the negotiated wage settlement unless the Union agrees in writing that the wage increase will not result in grievances or effect any other position.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect July 1, 1994.

PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

COUNCILMAN DeLUCA requests the Privilege of the Floor to Speak on a Point of Personal Privilege and states:

"This Resolution addresses the article in Sunday's Providence Journal exposing possible criminal conduct in the use of money from the

police detail account and the appearance of a cover-up by the City Solicitor and the Mayor and the Police Chief.

This Resolution and amendments I will offer, is based **one fact**, uncontested by all parties: The Mayor, just prior to Sunday's article in the Journal, ordered the Internal Affairs report to be handed over to the Attorney General. **Right There**, you have the appearance of a cover-up because if he ordered the report to be given to the Attorney General last week, he should have directed it to be given to him after the report was completed over a year ago. If there was no reason to do it then, there is no reason to do it now. But the Mayor says he gave the order **now** "out of an abundance of caution": **there you have a problem** — caution was needed then, not now, and it was not exercised.

It was not exercised because the report concerned friends and political aides of the Officials passing judgment upon the matter. **There is your old political corrupt situation** — in-siders protecting their political aides from the ordinary processes of government investigation, friendship clouding judgment and, as a consequence, bring the integrity of government in the City of Providence and of the Providence Police Department into disrepute.

It's the old story — once again it becomes obvious that there is a double standard — one for the politically connected and one for the ordinary citizen. Standard Operating Procedure, which required that this matter be handed over to the Attorney General, was violated. Once again, we have an instance of the arrogance and contempt for law and procedure by the Cianci Administration. The Triggs lease, an illegal Budget, secret deals to dispose of City property, an now, officials exceeding their authority and appointing themselves as Prosecutor, Judge and Jury on behalf of their friends and political aides.

The Council must take action. It cannot appear to be insensitive to this scandal or to be part of the in-sider network. We must be impartial and act to protect the City's reputation.

I must say that the City has not been well served by our accounting auditors, Peat Marwick. Payments for undocumented work should have been exposed by them. **But, the most amazing part of this scandal** is the logic displayed by the City Solicitor, Charles Mansolillo and the Chief of Police, Bernard Gannon. They reasoned that because there was a lack of required documentation, **therefore**, criminal wrong-doing was not proveable. Incredible! Surely, it was evident to them, **or should have been evident to them**, that the lack of required documentation is itself evidence of wrong-doing and that is why the matter should have been handed over to the Attorney General.

So, based upon the evident fact: — what was done last week should, according to Standard Operating Procedure, have been done upon completion of the Internal Affairs report over one year ago. I am asking the Council to approve this Resolution. I am especially concerned about the documentary evidence — boxes have a way of disappearing or of suffering water damage. I want the Attorney General or the State Police to seize every scrap of relevant paper and seize it now! The Council can empower the Internal Auditor to safeguard all material until that has happened.

I am offering an amendment — asking the Council, here and now, to vote for a Forensic Audit of the whole Police Detail Account. That is the only way we will find out what has gone on and satisfy the demands of our constituents.

Secondly, to protect the integrity of City Government and the Police Department, I am asking the Council approve an amendment calling on the Mayor to put Police Chief, Bernard Gannon, City Solicitor, Charles Mansolillo, Policy Director, Bill Collins and Acting Director of Public Property, Alan Sepe on an unpaid leave of absence until this matter has been cleared up.

The Mayor, by his actions and words, has shown he does not care about the integrity of government in the City of Providence. He has dismissed this whole scandal as part of the "silly season" — the same way he handled the Channel

6 scandal. So much for leadership working for you and ethics in government. Thank you Mr. President".
