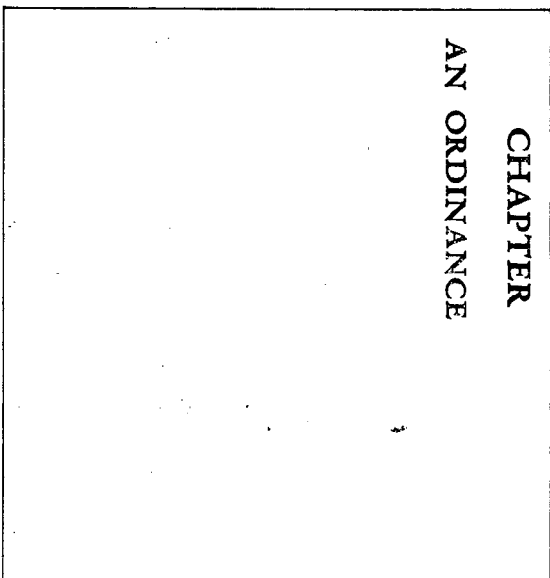

No. 256 AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 2, SECTION 151 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, 1946, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, PROVIDING MEALS FOR PRIMARY OFFICIALS AT POLLING PLACES, AND INCREASING PAY OF WARDENS AND CLERKS.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 2, Section 151 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1946, as heretofore amended is hereby further amended as follows:

"Every Primary warden and clerk appointed under the provisions of Title 17 of the Rhode Island General Laws, 1956, or any amendment thereof or addition thereto, shall be paid Thirty (\$30.00) Dollars for services rendered at the polling place on Primary Day. Every Supervisor appointed under said provisions of said Title 17 shall be paid Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars for services rendered at the polling place on Primary Day. The Board of Canvassers shall provide meals at the polling places for all primary officials and Police Officers on duty inside the polling places".
