





Prior to my extensive involvement in the Providence schools I had spent much time working with many other volunteer groups. When I lived in New London, Connecticut, from 1964 to 1969, I became President of the New London Jaycees and also held an honorary seat on the board of directors of the Southeastern Connecticut Chamber of Commerce. As President of the Jaycees I placed much emphasis on youth programs, individual development of young men and concentrated a lot of effort in the area of mental health. Under my direction and in cooperation with the Seaside Regional Center, Waterford Conn., we finalized a four year project that saw the opening of the first group home for retarded people in the nation, the Jaysea House. The project took thousands of man hours, a strong public relations program and procurement and budgeting of local, state and federal funds. The New London Jaycees received state and national acclaim for their efforts. The project was a model concept, and has since been copied accross the country.
