the following named person, firm or corporation is hereby granted permission to erect, alter or use a building or structure at the location named herein for the sale of petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil and their products, compounds and components as described and shown in and on the application therefor and accompanying plat, all on file in the office of the Inspector of Buildings subject to the conditions that said person, firm or corporation shall not violate any of the laws of the State of Rhode Island or any of the Ordinances of the City of Providence relative to the erection, use or occupation of said structure and that said person, firm or corporation shall not allow petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil or their products, compounds or components, to be conveyed over or across any sidewalk by means of any pipe or hose, and upon such special conditions as are hereby enumerated, viz:

Ward 8: George L. Potter, 97 Elmwood Avenue, Plat 30, Lot 367, 1-4,000 gallon gasoline storage tank additional making 9,000 gallons total storage capacity upon the premises.

SUBJECT: REFERRAL NO. 633 - ZONING CHANGE AT 420 CRANSTON STREET

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, July 20, 1954.

This referral is a request for a change in zoning from a C-1 Zone to a C-4 Zone of Lot 219 on Assessor's Plat 31 located on the southwesterly corner of Cranston Street at Hollis Street, and containing 5,157 square feet of land area.

On the field trip it was found that the area in question is at present occupied by a novelty shop, a restaurant, a radio and television appliance store, with six dwellings above.

The Commission

VOTED: To recommend that this petition be denied, since the establishing of a C-4 Zone in this area is not needed, and also to avoid a case of spot zoning and to prevent further street congestion on Cranston Street which is already a heavily traveled traffic artery.
