

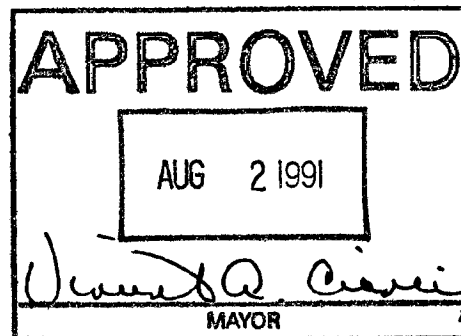

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 452

*Approved* August 2, 1991

WHEREAS, The Zoning Commission, the City Plan Commission and the Department of Planning and Development have been working for some time on a revised Zoning Ordinance for the City of Providence, and

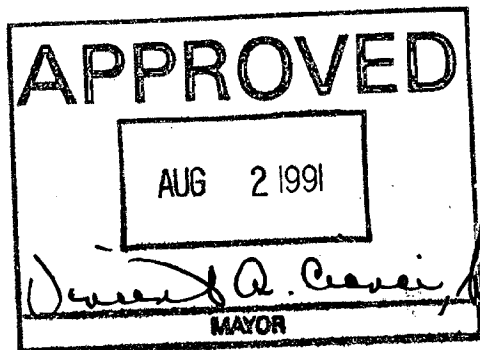
WHEREAS, This revised Zoning Ordinance will be a blueprint for the development of our City for future generations, and

WHEREAS, It is preferable to have development conform to the new Zoning Ordinance and avoid situations in which developers rush to obtain permits under the existing 1951 Zoning Ordinance,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Director of the Department of Inspection and Standards is directed to place a Moratorium on the issuance of building permits for new construction or any acceptance of variances of special exceptions in the Ninth and Eleventh Wards of the City of Providence pending the adoption of a new Zoning Ordinance by the City Council, or until December 31, 1991, whichever comes first, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Council may grant exceptions to the Moratorium only upon a showing of undue financial hardship. Any petitions for exception shall be referred for consideration and recommendation to the City Council Committee on Ordinances.
