

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 473

Approved August 22, 1997

WHEREAS, Both the City and State are considering the development of the Providence Place Shopping Mall to be located in the Capital Center.

WHEREAS, Providence Place Group (PPG) is proposing to construct and develop a super-regional shopping mall with at least 900,000 square feet of retail space to include two prominent anchor stores.

WHEREAS, This project's impact after construction, will generate at least 2,800 jobs, with a substantial number of these employees being employed in full and part time retail positions.

WHEREAS, The City of Providence should benefit substantially from employment recruitment and initiatives at Providence Place Shopping Mall, and initiate an agreement with Providence Place Group and the City of Providence to establish a "Providence Retail Job Training Program" in conjunction with services to be provided by Johnson and Wales University, External Affairs and Contract Training Office and the Center for Fashion Merchandising and Retail Studies.

WHEREAS, This "program" could be implemented by establishing a Providence based High School level "clearing house" of students who will be trained and prepared in the retail market through the Providence School Department's Career Vocational Office and Johnson and Wales University.
