Honorable City Council:

At a meeting of the Town Council of North Providence, held August 2nd, 1954, the Council voted to petition the City of Providence for permission to connect a lateral sewer into a manhole in the Canada Pond trunk line at Stanhope and Humbert Street.

There is a connection already provided for in this manhole which is 55 feet south of the Town line and in return for permission to connect the sewer at this point the Town of North Providence at no cost to the City of Providence would install a 12" sewer with laterals to the lots in Providence, in conformity with plans submitted Mr Mead and Mr Small for approval, and would construct the same to their specifications and direction,

This connection would provide sewers for a group of homes on Langdon, Spring and June Streets where recent polio cases have been attributed to the overflowing of cesspools that are unable to function for lack of drainage.

The need is urgent and any alternate plan would mean a long delay and a costly acquisition of land. It is hoped that permission can be granted so that the connection can be made this summer under the present contract with the sewer contractor.

Whereas, it is required by the provisions of Sec. 10 of Chapter 2514, Public Laws of Rhode Island, 1950, entitled "An Act Providing for Off-Street Parking Facilities in the City of Providence", that after the Mayor and Traffic Engineer have filed a report in accordance with the provisions of Section 9 of said Act, the City Council shall by resolution determine the necessity of the proposed public off-street parking facilities and the extent of any expenditure by the City for the purpose of establishing such improvements,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that it is hereby found and declared that the lack of adequate off-street parking facilities in the City of Providence creates confusion, obstructs the free circulation of traffic, diminishes property values and endangers the health, safety and general welfare of the public; and that the provision of conveniently located off-street parking facilities, attractive in cost, and the simultaneous public control of curb parking are, therefore, necessary to alleviate such conditions:

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Providence hereby determines that the off-street parking facilities proposed by the report of the Mayor and Traffic Engineer, dated October 1, 1954, and submitted to the City Council October 21, 1954, to be constructed on the area of land bounded by Pine, Page, Garnet and Friendship Streets, are necessary to alleviate the conditions heretofore enumerated; and that a sum of money, not exceeding one million seven hundred thousand (\$1,700,000) dollars shall be borrowed for that purpose by a subsequent resolution of the City Council.

SUBJECT: REFERRAL NO. 660 - ZONING CHANGE AT 204-210 NARRAGANSETT AVENUE

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, November 9, 1954.

This referral is a request for a change in zoning from an R-2 Zone to a C-4 Zone of Lots 163 and 22 on Assessor's Plat 61 located on the southeasterly corner of Roger Williams and Narragansett Avenues and the easterly side of Narragansett Avenue, and containing a total of 9,368 square feet of land area.

Reference is made to Referral No. 247, dated February 15, 1949, at which time a request was made to lower the zoning of these same two lots. The Commission's recommendation for denial was upheld by the City Council.

On the field trip it was found that one of the lots in question is presently vacant and the other lot is used for billboard advertising. The section of Narragansett Avenue that the petitioner's lots are on is predominantly residential.

The introduction of a C-4 Zone on the southeasterly corner of Roger Williams and Narragansett Avenues, which is an area that is primarily residential, would be unwarranted, particularly since this would constitute a case of spot zoning. Therefore,


