AMENDING CHAPTER 1996-36 OF THE CODE OF
ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE
ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE WITH REFERENCE
TO THE RESIDENCY OF EMPLOYEES, AS AMENDED"

Approved September 29, 1997

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Chapter 1996-36 entitled "An Ordinance With Reference to the Residency of Employees, as Amended" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence is further amended in the following manner:

(a) Paragraph 3 of Section 2 thereof shall read:

Any officer or employee of the City who, during employment ceases to be a resident and who is not exempt shall forfeit his or her position in the employ of the City. It shall be the duty of the Director of Personnel to monitor this residency requirement regularly and to report timely any violations to the Mayor and City Council for appropriate action. Violations may also be reported directly to the Residency Commission for investigation as provided for in section five (5).

(b.) There shall be a Commission of five (5) members, which shall enforce the residency requirement, as set forth above. All violations reported to the Mayor and/or City Council shall then be reported to the Commission for investigation and the Commission shall report to the Mayor and the City Council all findings together with a recommendation action. All violations reported directly to the Commission may be investigated and the Commission shall report to the Mayor and the City Council all findings together with a recommended action.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

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
