That the Superintendent of Street Signs and Numbers be and he is hereby directed to cause a sign to be placed on Byron Street from Broad Street to Pine Street, abandoned as aforesaid, having thereon the words, "Not a Public Highway", and it is further

Ordered, That after the entry of this order or decree the City Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published in a newspaper published in the County of Providence, at least once each week for three successive weeks and a further and personal notice shall be served by the City Sergeant upon every owner of land abutting Byron Street from Broad Street to Pine Street which has been abandoned, who is known to reside within this State.







Dear Councilman Matera:

We have been notified by the Office of the City Clerk that your Committee is considering the abandonment of Byron Street from Broad to Pine Street. Within this section to be abandoned the City has 362 ft. of 6" cast iron water pipe that was laid when the system was first started in 1871. In addition, there are 14 services of various sizes that will also be abandoned. Due to the fact that this highway has been abandoned in order to proceed with the development of a public housing project, known as Dexter Manor, there will be no charge on the part of the department for any of its facilities in that section of the highway to be abandoned.

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, November 15, 1960.

This referral is a request to abandon Byron Street as a public highway.

On an inspection and photographic survey it was determined that excavation of the street had taken place centrally and both extremes were curbed and paved but unopened for public use.

Since Byron Street has been included in the first development phase of the Weybosset Hill area of the Downtown Master Plan providing Public Housing for the Elderly, and the street abandonment is incidental to its development and will not effect the existing or proposed freeway circulation system,
