The Wanskuck Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Rhode Island, hereby requests that the City Council amend the Zoning Map which is a part of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Providence by changing from a Residence R-3 Zone to an Industrial M-1 Zone that certain lot of land owned by it and located on the westerly side of Charles Street, which is a portion of lot No. 29 on Assessor's Plat 76 for the City of Providence, and which is more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the westerly line of Charles Street, one hundred seven and 05/100 (107.05) feet northerly from a granite bound at the northeast corner of land now or lately belonging to Silver Spring Realty Co; thence running northerly, bounded easterly by said Charles Street two hundred (200) feet; thence turning an interior angle of  $45^{\circ}00'$  and running southwesterly, seventy and 71/100 (70.71) feet; thence turning an interior angle of  $225^{\circ}$  and running westerly fifty (50) feet; thence turning at right angles and running southerly seventy (70) feet; thence turning an interior angle of  $153^{\circ}26'$  and running southeasterly forty-nine and 20/100 (49.20) feet; thence turning an interior angle of  $164^{\circ}03'50''$  and running southeasterly forty-eight and 83/100 (48.83) feet; thence turning an interior angle of  $132^{\circ}30'10''$  and running easterly forty-five (45) feet to the point of beginning, and contains 14,280 square feet of land.

SUBJECT: REFERRAL NO. 530 - ZONING CHANGE ON THE WESTERLY SIDE OF CHARLES STREET

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, October 27, 1953.

This referral is a request for a change in zoning from a Residence R-3 Zone to an Industrial M-1 Zone that certain lot of land located on the westerly side of Charles Street which is a portion of Lot No. 29 on Assessor's Plat 76. The whole of Lot 29 contains 1,163,911 square feet of land area and lies in an R-3 Zone. The area in question contains 14,280 square feet of land area.

On the field trip it was found that the area is at present vacant. Leonard's Pond runs through the area.

The area in question lies within and adjacent to two proposed projects: (1) preferred location for Louisquisset Pike, and (2) the extension of Silver Spring Street southwest to Chad Brown Street. While the Louisquisset Pike itself will not interfere with this project, it is entirely possible that approach connecting ramps will be required in this location, quite possibly necessitating the use of the property in question; the extension of Silver Spring Street is a recommendation contained in the MASTER PLAN FOR THOROUGHFARES and should not be blocked by development in its path.

The Commission

VOTED: To recommend that this area remain in an R-3 Zone until plans for the Louisquisset Pike and any necessary connecting roads in this vicinity have been determined. It is further recommended that the

denial be without prejudice in view of the possibility of rezoning the area between Charles Street and the Louisquisset Pike to commercial or industrial zoning following the determination of the above plans.
