No. 545 **AN ORDINANCE** AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE CHAPTER 1971-38 APPROVED JUNE 23, 1971, BY APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED (\$2,400.00) DOLLARS TO HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION, ITEM 1 and ITEM 5.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1971-38 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, as approved June 23, 1971, entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$71,942,933.24 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Period Beginning July 1, 1971 and Ending June 30, 1972", as amended, is hereby further amended by appropriating to HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION as follows:

ITEM 1 - Nineteen Hundred (\$1900.00) Dollars.

ITEM 5 - Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars.

SECTION 2. The said sum of Two Thousand Four Hundred (\$2,400.00) Dollars shall be obtained by authorizing and directing the City Controller and City Treasurer to transfer a like amount from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account to the Receipt Account.

SECTION 3. The estimated receipts from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account are hereby increased by Two Thousand Four Hundred (\$2,400.00) Dollars.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

WHEREAS, Congressman Fernand J. St. Germain has recently presented, upon the floor of the House of Representatives in the Congress of the United States of America, his concern of the United States Middle East Policy in the present Arab-Israel Conflict, and

WHEREAS, with the threat that these two Nations may go to War, it becomes a matter of deep concern with the state of affairs that now exists by the ever increasing Soviet military involvement in Egypt that without further delay, Israel's request for Phantom Jet War Planes is a means of that Country's survival, and

WHEREAS, Congressman Fernand J. St. Germain's timely and necessary message to his colleagues highlighted the events in that part of the world accurately,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the congratulations of His Honor, Mayor Joseph A. Doorley, Jr., of the City of Providence, Rhode Island, and the City Council of that City are hereby extending to Congressman Fernand J. St. Germain, upon his excellent presentation with pointed facts in showing concern for the request for military assistance from the United States of America, which would act as a deterrent to the possibility of war between the Arab and Israeli Nations.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 548

Approved December 6, 1971

WHEREAS, The Providence City Council takes note of the mounting Campaign of persecution and harassment currently being conducted in the Soviet Union against those of its Jewish Citizens who have attempted to exercise the fundamental human right of emigration as set for by the United Nations' declaration that "Every person has a right to leave any country, including his own", and

WHEREAS, this vicious Campaign recently culminated in the show trial of eleven citizens of Leningrad, including nine Jews, on charges of allegedly attempting to commandeer a small aircraft for the purpose of escaping from the Soviet Union, and in the meting out of sentences whose severity was out of all proportion to the charge.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Providence City Council joins with all men of conscience throughout the World in condemning this scurrilous anti-Semitic campaign reminiscent of the worst excesses of the former Nazi regime in Germany, and expresses its support for those members of the world-wide Jewish community who are currently pleading with the Soviet Union to "Let My People Go", and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon the adoption of this Resolution, the same be transmitted to the President of the United States of America; the respective Chairman of the House of Representatives Committee on Foreign Relations; the United States Senate Committee on Foreign Relations and to the Congressional Delegations from the State of Rhode Island.


Dear Mr. Vespia:


