Section 1 of Chapter 103 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1948, entitled "An Ordinance Designating 17 Areas of Land in the City of Providence as Redevelopment Areas in Accordance with the Provisions of Section 22 of Chapter 1802 of the Public Laws, 1946, Known as the Community Redevelopment Act'" as amended is hereby further amended by inserting the following description at the end of the description set forth under the heading "Redevelopment Area D-7".



SECTION 1: Section 1 of Chapter 1248 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1944, as reenacted by Section 79 of Chapter 2 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1946, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 79. Exchange of registered bonds for coupon bonds.

"The City Treasurer may from time to time and upon request of the holders of registered bonds, issue coupon bonds payable to bearer, or cause them to be issued, in exchange for a like principal amount of such registered bonds of the city."

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1: Section 49 of Chapter 20, of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1914, as reenacted by Chapter 2, Section 77 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1946, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 77. Surrender of coupon bonds.

"Whenever any holder of any of the coupon bonds of the city shall surrender such bonds to the City Treasurer with the unpaid coupons affixed, accompanied by a request for registered bonds in like value, said City Treasurer is empowered to make such exchange and he shall make such entry in a book kept for that purpose that will identify the complete transaction of exchange."



WHEREAS, certain sections of the Island of Sicily have been destroyed by a series of earthquakes in January of this year, which has focused International attention upon that section of the Republic of Italy, the country of origin of so many of our citizens, and their issues, who have established themselves in the United States of America as a segment of the population that contributed to its greatness, and which calls out for aid to rehabilitate the devastation to the property lost and the people made homeless, and

WHEREAS, ever vigilant to the plight of peoples of the World, America assisted at a propitious time, and albeit some of the essentials of life have been forwarded to the suffering people of Sicily, many are homeless and may remain in such a state for such period of time as to cause irreparable damage to their health and welfare, and

WHEREAS, ever alert to the dire needs of people, irrespective of race or country, Senators Pastore and Pell, and Representative Tiernan have caused the introduction of appropriate bills in the Senate and in the House of Representatives, namely, S-3020 and H.R. 14865, which would grant the issuance of three thousand special immigrant visas to citizens of Italy in the case of S-3020, and two thousand under H.R. 14865, who are homeless.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, that His Honor the Mayor and the Members of the City Council do hereby express to the sponsors of the bills, now pending in Congress, their interest in the adoption and the implementation thereof so that a certain limited number of displaced natives of this area who suffered as a result of this recent natural calamity be admitted to the United States of America as further proof to suffering people that, whenever possible, America opens its heart and arms to deserving peoples at a time when they are in need of aid.
