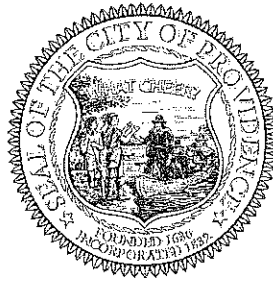

**The Following Ordinance was in City Council December 7, 2017, Read and Passed the First Time and is Returned for Passage the Second Time:**

**COUNCILMAN IGLIOZZI, (By Request):**

An Ordinance Relating to Article IV, Chapter 17, Section 17-192(F) of the Code of Ordinances (Disability Waiver Request).

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the language of Section 17-192(F) of the Code of Ordinances which provides that the application to accomplish such [accidental disability] retirement must be filed within eighteen (18) months of the date of the accident, the Retirement Board of the City of Providence, shall consider and act upon the accidental disability retirement application of Nicholas K. Date, even though more than eighteen (18) months have passed since the date of the accident which is the averred proximate cause of the above-named applicant for a disability retirement allowance.

SECTION 2. Said application shall be subject to and considered in accordance with all other applicable ordinances, regulations, standards and practices relating to accidental disability retirement applications.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.


