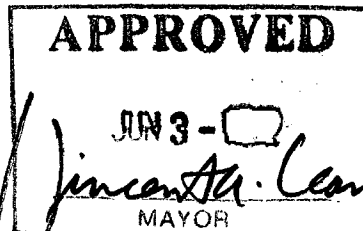
ORDERED, That the Director of Public Works be and he is hereby directed to cause a sign to be placed on the above-named highway, abandoned as aforesaid, having thereon the words, "Not a Public Highway" and it is further

ORDERED, That after the entry of this order or decree the City Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published in a newspaper, published in the County of Providence at least once a week for three successive weeks and a further and personal notice shall be served by the City Sergeant upon every owner of land abutting the above-named highway which has been abandoned, who is known to reside within the State.

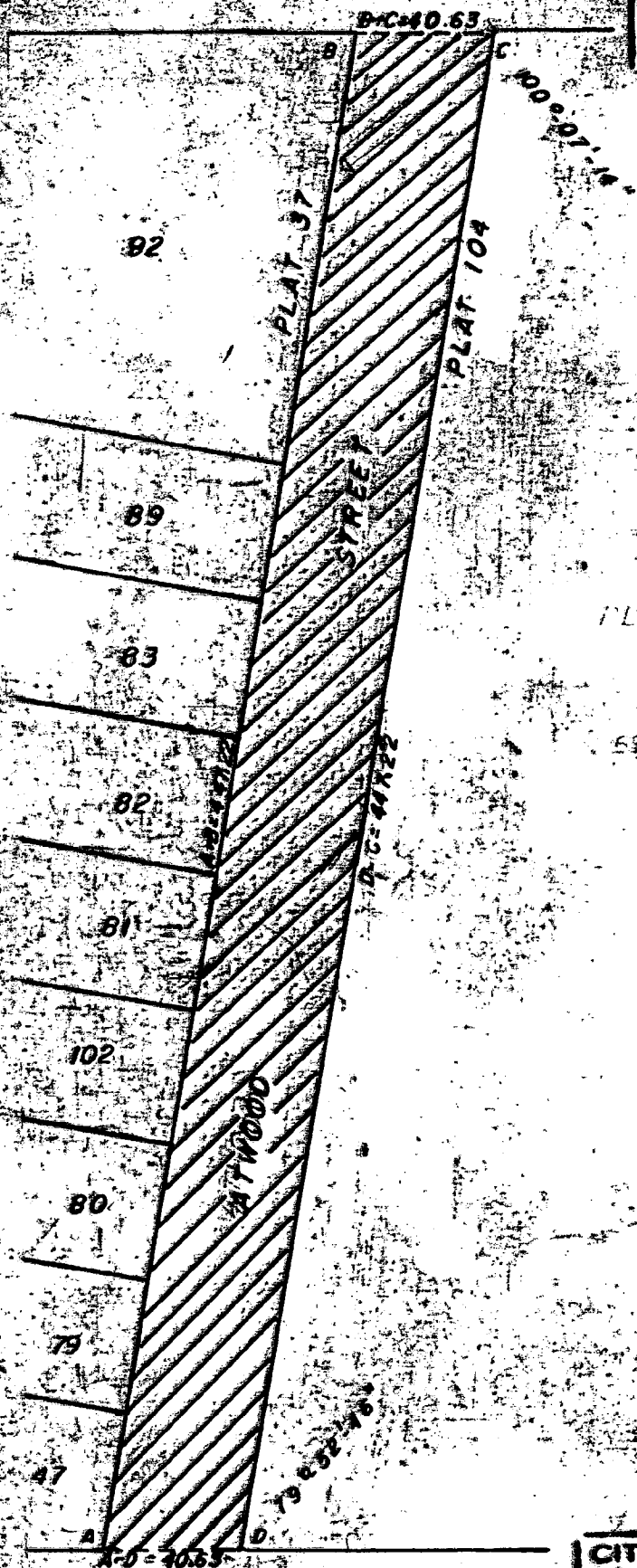



CPC Referral No. 2053 - Abandonment Portion of Atwood Street from
Sterling Avenue to Wallace Street

A communication from the Committee on Public Works dated February 19, 1982 contained a proposal to abandon the entire width of that portion of Atwood Street from Sterling Avenue running southerly for a distance of approximately four hundred forty-eight ft. (448') to Wallace Street. The petition was submitted by Robert Corsi at 22 Sterling Avenue and was introduced to the City Council by Councilman Dillon and Councilman Flynn by request of the petitioner and was referred to the Committee on Public Works on February 18, 1982 for further study.

A field inspection revealed that the entire Atwood Street runs southerly from Sterling Avenue to Union Street. The only portion of Atwood Street in question is an unimproved street without curbs, pavement and sidewalks. But it is grassed and fenced at both ends of the subject portion of the street. As indicated on the Assessor's Plat Map, this 40 ft. wide street runs northerly from Wallace Street for a distance of approximately 250 ft. and sloping sharply downward 28 ft. within a distance of approximately 90 ft; then it runs for a distance of 108 ft. to Sterling Avenue. The topography of the street in question precludes the possibility of its ever being developed as a through street. There is no utility line under that portion of the street. There are vacant lots at the easterly side of the street except a single family house (petitioner's home) at the corner of Sterling Avenue and Atwood Street and a six dwelling unit structure at the corner of Wallace and Atwood Streets. There is a City playground at the westerly side of the street.

Based on the above findings, the Department of Planning and Urban Development recommends that the Commission advise the Committee on Public Works that no objection is offered on this petition.

The City Plan Commission, at its March 3, 1982 regular monthly meeting, reviewed and evaluated the subject petition which contained a request by Robert Corsi at 22 Sterling Avenue for the abandonment of a portion of Atwood Street from Sterling Avenue to Wallace Street for a distance of approximately four hundred forty-eight feet (448').

A field inspection revealed that the entire Atwood Street runs southerly from Sterling Avenue to Union Street. The portion of Atwood Street in question is presently unimproved and has no curbs, pavement or sidewalks. It is grassed and fenced at both ends of the subject portion of the street. As indicated on the Assessor's Plat Map, this 40 ft. wide street runs northerly from Wallace Street for a distance of approximately 250 ft. and sloping sharply downward 28 ft. within a distance of approximately 90 ft; then it runs for a distance of 108 ft. to Sterling Avenue. The topography of the street in question precludes the possibility of its ever being developed as a through street. There is no utility line under that portion of the street. There are vacant lots at the easterly side of the street with the exception of a single family house (petitioner's home) at the corner of Sterling Avenue and Atwood Street and a six dwelling unit structure at the corner of Wallace and Atwood Streets. After due consideration, the Commission voted to render the following recommendation to the City Council:

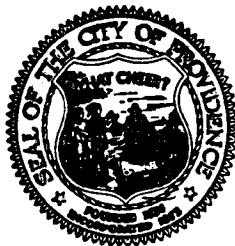


