WHEREAS, Rhode Island Hospital has contractual agreements in place to build a New Children's Hospital, and




WHEREAS, Due to the financial obligations that were in place prior to the passage of the moratorium, Rhode Island Hospital would like to be relieved of this moratorium,

Rhode Island Hospital is aware that there is a resolution of the City Council dated February 28, 1991, which places a moratorium on the issuance of building permits for new construction or any acceptance of variances or special exceptions in the Eleventh Ward of the City of Providence pending the adoption of a new Zoning Ordinance by the City Council or until July 1, 1991, whichever comes first. Rhode Island Hospital has received its certificate of need to proceed with the construction of a new Children's Hospital and would anticipate ground breaking, specifically on the foundation and site work, as early as June of this year. We are asking consideration of the City Council to permit an exception to its current resolution, so that the construction of the Children's Hospital is not delayed.

This is a critically-needed project which will be a significant resource for not only the residents of Providence but the entire State and region. We would be happy to discuss any of the specifics of the project or our need for this exception at the Council's convenience.
