## MINUTE

Frank J. Duffy, Attorney, was a native of County Monahan, Ireland, where he was born on February 2, 1886, a son of the late Michael and Sarah (Duffy) Duffy. He was brought to this Country as a child and received his early education in the public schools of the Pawtuxet Valley section and of the City of Providence. As a young man he worked in several mills in the surrounding communities and was a member of the Wool Sorters Union. Following his graduation from Albany Law School he took several special courses at Brown University.

Mr. Duffy was unofficially, but affectionately known as the "Mayor of Olneyville". He served as President of the Board of Alderman for two years. Numbered among his appointments to City Government was his membership to the Finance Committee and as a member of the Board of Contract and Supply.

Mr. Duffy was an indefatigable worker in the Olneyville Bussinessmen's Association which he served as its President. He numbered among his affiliations membership in the Holy Name Society of St. Anthony's Church; Providence Council Knights of Columbus; the Robert Emmet Society; and the Rhode Island Bar Association.

WHEREAS, according to the statements in the Press, Mr. Nashir delivered a talk consisting of Arab propaganda, attacking the State of Israel, a friendly and Democratic State in near East, and

WHEREAS, the statements delivered were grossly misrepresented, many of them distorted and dishonestly described, and

WHEREAS, these talks have been attacked and criticized by the Director of World Affiars Council of Rhode Island John S. Gibson in the letter to the Editor under date of October 25, 1953.
