No. 238 AN ORDINANCE

AMENDING CHAPTER 761, SECTION 62

OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE APPROVED AUGUST 7, 1953.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1: Chapter 761 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence approved August 7, 1953, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:

SECTION 62: CHARLES V. CHAPIN HOSPITAL

The Sackin-Shocket Post, J.M.V. #533, requests that a square be dedicated in memory of one of our deceased comrades, Alfred Silver, at the corner of Sparrow St. & Oakland Ave.

The late, Alfred Silver, who entered service on Oct 20, 1950 fought gallantly and was trapped by Chinese troops with other volunteers while attempting to rescue U.N. personnel, and killed in action in Korea on Aug. 27, 1951. He was the first Jewish boy and only one at that time killed in service in Korean duty.

He was awarded Combat Infantryman's Badge, Purple Heart, and Korean Service Valor Ribbon.

We hope that this request be granted as soon as possible.
