RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 329

Approved April 11, 1979

RESOLVED, THAT WHEREAS, the City of Providence is eligible to receive Community Development Block Entitlement Funds for the fiscal year, 1980, under the Community Development Act of 1974 (Public Laws 93-383);

WHEREAS, the said application for funding shall be filed with the Department of Housing and Urban Development not later than April 15, 1979.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Providence, County of Providence, State of Rhode Island, hereby authorizes the City of Providence, through its official representative, the Mayor, to file an application for Community Development Block Grant Entitlement Funds for the fiscal year 1980, and to do all acts necessary to successfully acquire said funds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all moneys received by the City of Providence from the Federal Government under the provisions of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (Public Laws 93-383), shall be expended in accordance with the provisions of said Act.
