RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 666

Approved December 8, 1982

RESOLVED, DECREED AND ORDERED

That the following named street shown as cross-hatched area on the accompanying plan entitled, "Providence, Rhode Island, Department of Public Works - Engineering Office, Street Line Section Plan No. 064219, dated September 22, 1982",

VIZ:

Pike Street (block of) running in a westerly direction from South Water Street, a total of fifty (50) feet to the Providence River, shown as cross-hatched area on accompanying plan and designated by the letters (A-B-C-D-A), having ceased to be useful to the public and is proposed to be abandoned as a Public Highway, subject to a 20' foot sewer easement designated by the letters (E-F-G-H-E), and the damages to the abutters is appraised at nothing and so awarded, and it is further,

ORDERED, That the Director of Public Works be and he is hereby directed to cause a sign to be placed on the above-named highway abandoned as aforesaid, having thereon the words, "Not a Public Highway", and it is further

ORDERED, That after the entry of this order or decree the City Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published in a newspaper published in the County of Providence at least once a week for three successive weeks and a further and personal notice shall be served by the City Sergeant upon every owner of land abutting the above-named highway which has been abandoned, who is known to reside within the State.

PETITION TO THE CITY COUNCIL

TO THE HONORABLE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE:

The undersigned respectfully petitions your honorable body

to entertain our request for abandonment of the block of Pike Street running in a westerly direction from South Water Street, a total of fifty feet to the Providence River.

As sole owners of all adjacent property, Plat 18, Lots 12 and 13 (see enclosed city street map and city property section), we request abandonment of this long deserted portion of Pike Street.

Presently, this portion of Pike Street remains a street in name only as it is unpaved, no longer maintained by the city, and of necessity to no one. There is an existing brick building, erected approximately eighty years ago, directly on the street itself (see enclosed photographs). The next adjoining block of Pike Street was previously abandoned in 1977 (see enclosed city street map and city property section).

We are prepared to invest considerably in this property:

- to save and rehabilitate a historic building on the city's waterfront;
- to construct a substantial new building on the site;
- to make a long term commitment to the revitalization of this area.

Our initiative will spur on and encourage future growth and investment in the India Point area.

The City Council's abandonment of this small, unmaintained section of a former street would restore it to the City's Tax Roll, and enable our plans of developing this vacant, neglected land to go forth.



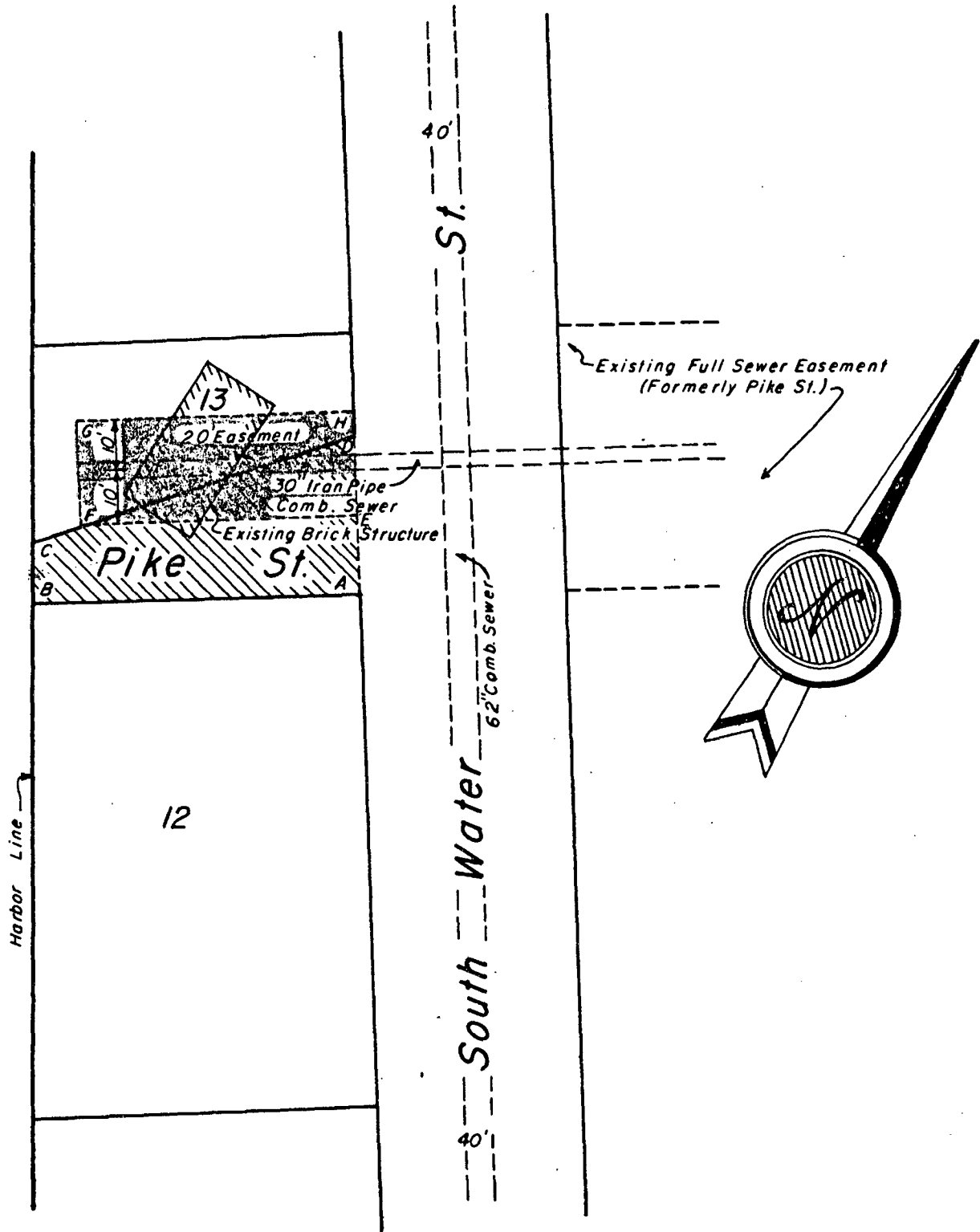



Gentlemen:

The City Plan Commission at its October 6, 1982 regular monthly meeting reviewed and evaluated the subject petition which contained a request by Johanna Killeen and Thomas Bates, owners of properties on both sides of subject portion of Pike Street, for the abandonment of aforesaid street.

A field inspection revealed that subject portion of Pike Street is a dead-end unimproved street. It contains approximately 1,500 sq. ft. of area and is 57 feet long from South Water Street to the harbor line. The size of subject street precludes any possibility of its being developed as a street without additional takings.

After due consideration, the Commission voted to recommend to the Committee that this petition be denied on the grounds that even though the right-of-way has no value for automobile access, it can provide public access to the waterfront. Moreover, the petition does not indicate any intended use for the property.

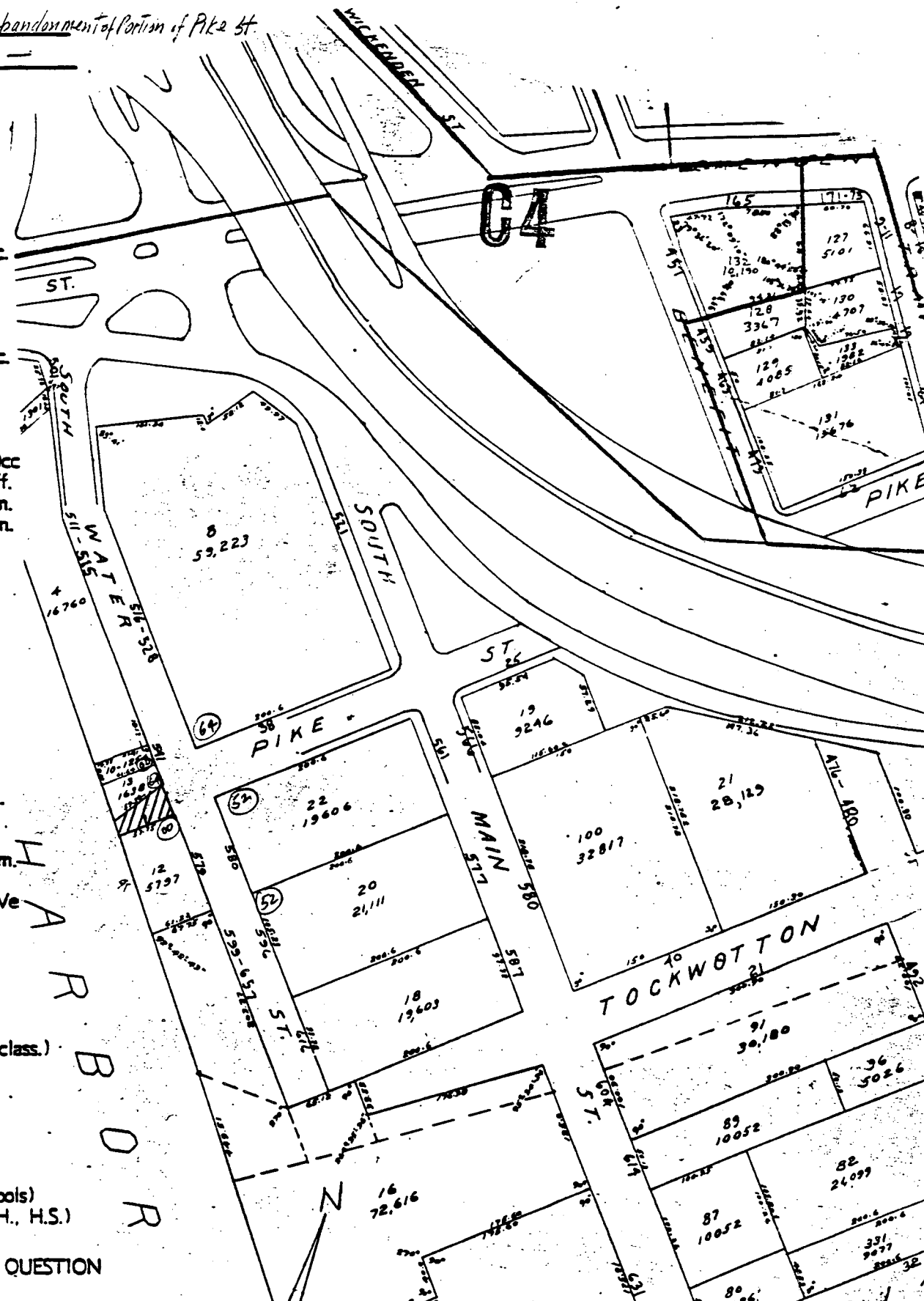

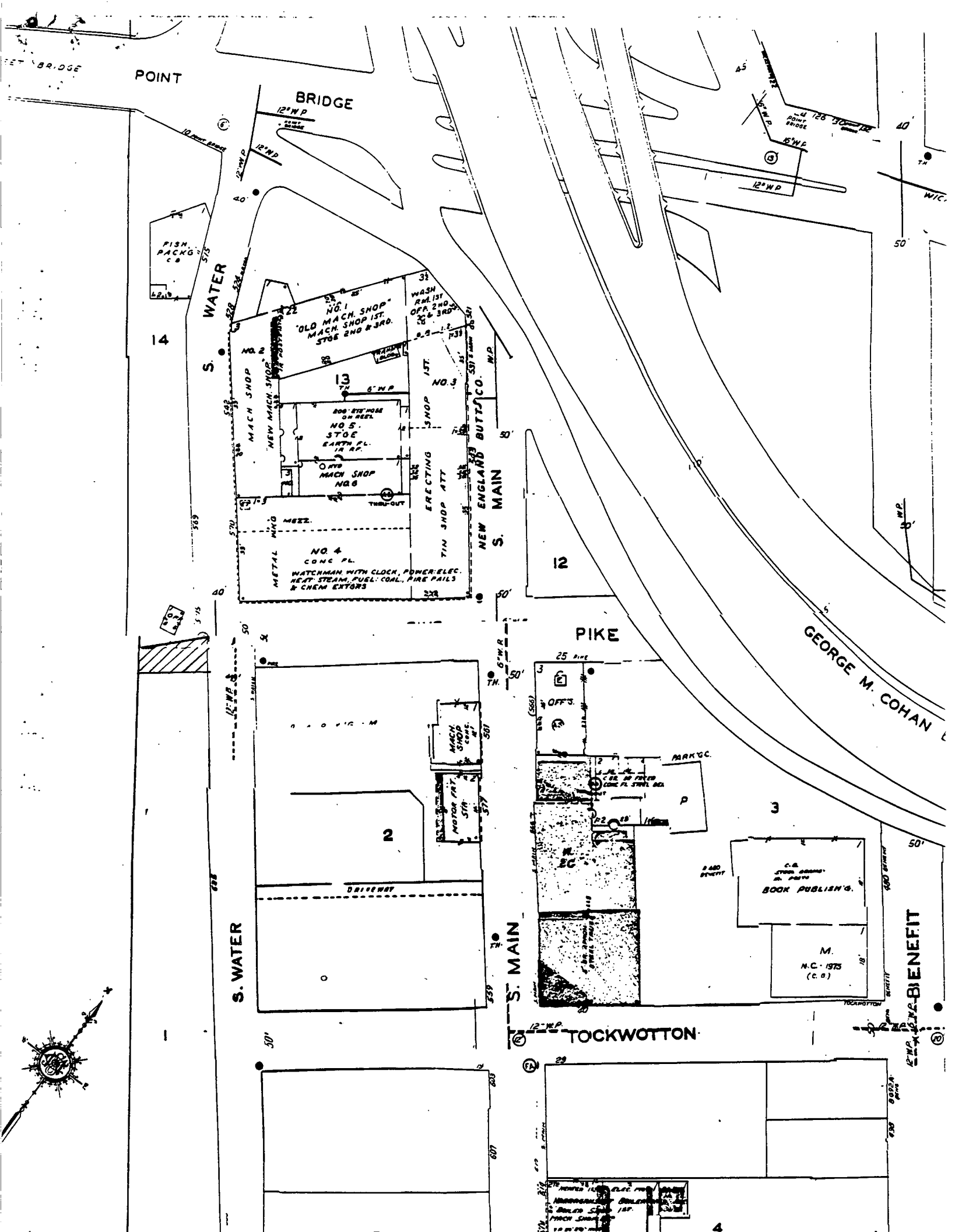

A review of our distribution system shows that the Water Supply Board does not have any water mains or water utilities in the portion to be abandoned; therefore has no objection to the granting of this petition.

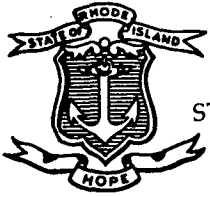

It has come to the attention of the Coastal Resources Management Council (CRMC) that a Public Hearing on the Petition of Johanne Killien and Thomas H. Bates to abandon Pike Street, running in a Westerly direction from South Water Street, a total of fifty (50) feet to the Providence River, is to be held tonight in the Chamber of the City Council, City Hall, Providence, Rhode Island.
