

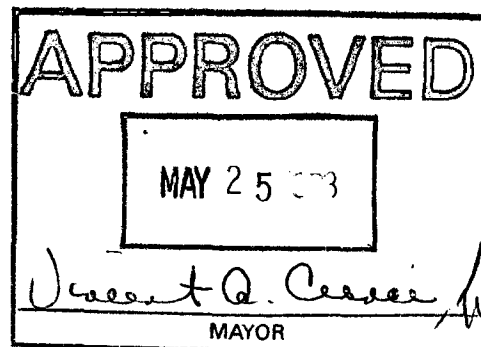

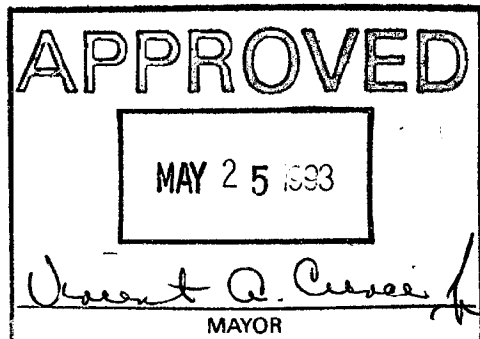

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 32-2-7 of the General Laws in Chapter 32-2
2 entitled "Metropolitan Park District of Providence Plantations" is
3 hereby amended to read as follows:
4 32-2-7. Agreements with cities and towns -- Transfer of control
5 of parks to and from cities and towns. -- (A) Any city or town within
6 said metropolitan park district is hereby authorized and empowered to
7 transfer the care and control of any open space owned or controlled by
8 it to said department of environmental management, upon such terms and
9 conditions and for such period as may be mutually agreed upon; or to
10 enter into an agreement in writing with said department for the joint
11 care, control, or preservation of open spaces within or adjacent to
12 such city or town; and the department of environmental management may
13 in like manner transfer the care, control, and preservation of any
14 open space controlled by them to any city or town within the said
15 metropolitan park district, with the consent of such city or town and
16 upon such terms and for such period as may be mutually agreed upon.

1 (B) To the extent that any open space cared for and controlled by
2 a city or town in said metropolitan park district, and for which said
3 city or town can document in a manner satisfactory to the director of
4 environmental management, at least fifty percent (50%) usage by
5 non-residents of said city or town, but by residents of Rhode Island,
6 then the department of environment management shall contribute twenty-
7 five percent (25%) of the operating budget for the maintenance of said
8 park to said city or town.

9 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
