
WHEREAS, Lot 83 on City Assessor's Plat 44 is vacant and not useful for any municipal purpose, and


WHEREAS, The lot could be disposed of by the Providence Redevelopment Agency for purposes beneficial to the City.



Special Vacant Lot Project  
Parcel No. 208  
A.P. 44 Lot 83

That lot of land with all buildings and improvements thereon, situate in the City of Providence and State of Rhode Island, laid out and delineated as Lot No. 100 (one hundred) on that plat entitled, "Plat of house lots in Cranston belonging to Updike & Burgess by Cushing & Farnum 1857", and recorded in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds in said City of Providence in Plat Book 9 at page 28 and (copy) on Plat Card 253.

Said lot is bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point on the southerly line of Moore Street at the northeasterly corner of land now or lately of Herman Holtzman and wife; thence westerly bounding northerly on Moore Street ninety-six and 52/100 (96.52) feet to land now or lately of Earle H. Brennan, et al; thence southwesterly bounding southeasterly in part on said last named land and in part on other land now or lately of Earle H. Brennan in all one hundred four and 71/100 (104.71) feet to land now or lately of Frank Souza, Jr. and wife; thence westerly bounding southerly on said last named land forty three (43) to said Holtzman land; thence northerly bounding westerly on said Holtzman land ninety (90) feet to the point of beginning.
