PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

COUNCILMAN LOMBARDI Requests and is Granted the floor to speak on a Point of Personal Privilege.

"Madam President and Members of the City Council. I have been away for the last two weeks on vacation and there are a couple of things that I want to clarify.

"Number one, with regard to the Article in the paper with regard to the Council Presidency. I just want my colleagues to know that and especially Councilman Glavin, I am certainly not frightened about anything and I am not interested in the Council Presidency nor am I interested in the Majority Leadership. I just want to clarify that.

"The second thing and more important thing I want to clarify is the editorial in today's paper, I just had an opportunity just now to read through it. With regard to DPIA, I know that many of my colleagues are working very, very hard and diligently in trying to come up with some cuts that would help the City in a positive way, and this is one of the things that is suggested to be cut out.

"I just want to say that the DPIA does a wonderful job and if you read the editorial this is one of the few departments where most of the funds come from the private sector and the editorial stated that 27% of the crew's expenses are paid through donations from the private sector. That number is wrong.

Out of \$125,000.00, approximately \$70,000.00 is paid through private donations and I just hope that we don't bite our nose to spite our face because what will happen is and you can see it happening now, overtime would be required to try and handle some of the things that we need to take care of in the City, and those dollars that would be spent on overtime would be more than ample than what it would probably cost to run this department.

So, this is one of the few things where the majority of the money comes from the private sector.

I just wanted to make a note of that. Thank you."

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That it was, and is the intent of the City Council by the passage of those Levy and Appropriation Ordinances as hereinafter set forth that:

(i) The tax rates for real and personal and tangible excise taxes for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1992 set by the City Assessor, shall not exceed the Tax Rates for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1991;

(ii) That the passage of such Ordinances relied upon the following representations by the City Finance Department, to wit; that the apportionment of the Levy upon assessed values of the City would be as follows:

(iii) That in addition to the One Hundred Fifty-Two Million, Seventy Eight Thousand, Twenty-Eight Dollars (\$152,078,028.00) collected from the FY 1993 Levy, an additional Seven Million, Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$7,450,000.00) in back taxes received shall be appropriated in FY 1993;

(iv) That One Hundred Fifty-Nine Million, Five Hundred Twenty-Eight Thousand, Twenty-Eight Dollars (\$159,528,028.00) of such property and excise taxes be appropriated for the Budget of FY 1993;

(v) That the total Levy for FY 1993 not exceed One Hundred Sixty-Nine Million, Fifteen Thousand, One Hundred Dollars (\$169,015,100.00) as set forth in (ii) above (levy);

(vi) That the Council was acting pursuant to its power in Article 805 of the Providence City Charter to decrease the Appropriation Ordinance presented by the Administration by a total of Nine Million, One Hundred Sixty-Six Thousand One Hundred Sixty-Five Dollars (\$9,166,165.00), and

"Madam President and Members, I wish to speak on a point of personal privilege regarding a document that came into my possession, a combination of a Contract and Agreement between the Providence School Board and the Association of Providence Public Schools and Staff Administrators for the Years 1992-1993, 1993-1994 and 1994-1995.

"This agreement seems to include in it anyone who works for the School Department except the Teachers. This agreement is based on the

Teachers Contract. It is basically a mirror image of the Teachers Benefits. It uses the Teachers highest salary as a frame of reference to establishing salaries for Administrative and Management positions, using a ratio method. This agreement also covers 100 custodians, all the bus monitors, clerical staff, cafeteria staff and so on.

"I have some legal and financial concerns about this agreement and would like to leave this copy with the City Clerk so that all of you may have the opportunity to study it and formulate your own opinion."
