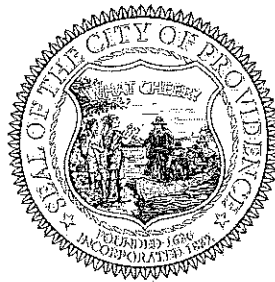

Resolution Recognizing April as Sexual Assault Awareness Month.

**WHEREAS**, Sexual Assault Awareness Month is intended to draw attention to the fact that sexual violence is widespread and impacts every community, including our own; and

**WHEREAS**, Rape, sexual assault, and sexual harassment impact our community as reflected in estimates that show that one in eight women in Rhode Island has been sexually assaulted during her lifetime, and nationally, nearly one in five women and approximately one in 71 men will be raped at some point in their lives; and

**WHEREAS**, Child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to confront the reality that in this country one in six boys and one in four girls will experience a sexual assault before the age 18; and

**WHEREAS**, Studies have consistently found that people with developmental disabilities face higher rates of sexual assault, with 15,000 to 19,000 raped each year in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, Individuals, organizations, and public officials must work together to educate our community about sexual violence prevention, to support survivors, and to speak out against harmful attitudes and actions; and

**WHEREAS**, With leadership, dedication, and encouragement, there is evidence that we can successfully prevent sexual violence in Providence through increased education, awareness, and community involvement; and

**WHEREAS**, National organizations, such as the National Sexual Violence Resource Center, and local advocacy groups, such as Day One, the Sexual Assault & Trauma Resource Center, promote April as Sexual Assault Awareness Month as part of a campaign to prevent sexual violence; and

**WHEREAS**, The City of Providence strongly supports the efforts of national, state, and local partners, and of every citizen, to actively engage in public and private efforts to prevent sexual violence.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, That the City Council of the City of Providence does hereby join advocates and communities across the country in supporting efforts to prevent sexual violence.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the City of Providence recognizes the month of April each year as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month."

## **COUNCILMAN ZURIER**

Resolution Regarding Presidential Credibility.

**WHEREAS**, On March 4, 2017, President Trump announced in a Tweet that “Obama had my ‘wires tapped’ during the very sacred election process”; and

**WHEREAS**, Despite repeated requests, President Trump refused to provide any evidence to support his allegation; and

**WHEREAS**, On March 16, 2017, the President’s press secretary repeated a Fox News claim that the previous administration had used the British security agency to conduct surveillance on the Trump campaign; and

**WHEREAS**, The British security agency described those allegations as “utterly ridiculous” and demanded a retraction; and

**WHEREAS**, The Trump administration’s national security adviser was reported to have contacted the British government to apologize privately, but the Trump administration denied that any apology was made; and

**WHEREAS**, On March 20, 2017, the Directors of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the National Security Administration both testified to Congress that there was no information to support the tweeted allegation concerning the former President’s supposed wiretapping of candidate Trump; and

**WHEREAS**, During the 2016 Presidential campaign, then-candidate Trump admitted for the first time that his “birther” allegations about then-President Obama were false, five years after the former President produced his birth certificate, using the occasion to claim credit for having uncovered the true answer to his false accusations; and

**WHEREAS**, The damage from the tragedy of Vietnam was amplified and magnified by the “credibility gap” of President Johnson, causing great damage to the country and an indelible stain on the Johnson Presidency; and

**WHEREAS**, The damage from the Watergate crisis was amplified and magnified by the Nixon administration's cover-up, including the practice of declaring prior statements "no longer operative" by the White House press secretary, disrupting the nation's well-being and leaving an indelible stain on the Nixon Presidency; and

**WHEREAS**, The President's credibility is critical to the nation's standing with other countries, the integrity of the country's democratic institutions, and the legitimacy of the President himself with the American people, including the citizens of the City of Providence.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, That the Providence City Council hereby calls upon the President of the United States to repair the damage to the office's credibility sustained from the false wire-tapping and surveillance allegations, by

1. Publicly apologizing to the British government for wrongly accusing them of surveillance of the Trump campaign,
2. Publicly apologizing to former President Obama for falsely accusing him of wiretapping, and
3. Explaining to the American people how he, as President, is going to restore credibility to himself and to his office.


